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Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic

The Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic is prepared by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic. The periodical describes recent developments in the external sector and contains statistical data on the balance of payments, external trade, international reserves, external debt and an international investment position, as well as a technique and a database to compile the balance of payments. It is published four times a year - in January, May, July, and October. It is published in three languages: Kyrgyz, Russian, and English.

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Annual Report of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic

This publication is a comprehensive report of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic for the previous year. It contains brief information on economic development of the Kyrgyz Republic, monetary policy, financial statements and general information about the National Bank, and statistical appendixes.

It is published in three languages: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

Banking System Development Trends

This publication provides analysis and assessment of development of the banking system of the Kyrgyz Republic as a financial intermediary, and also evaluation of stability components of the banking system of the Kyrgyz Republic. It is published semi-annually (as of January 1 and July 1) in the Kyrgyz, Russian and English languages.

Inflation Report

This publication contains description of consumer price movements in the Republic and its regions, analysis of major inflation factors, information about the decisions of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic in the monetary policy area, and presents the inflation forecast for the upcoming period.

It is published quarterly in the Kyrgyz, Russian and English languages.

Statutory Acts of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic

The aim of this publication is to officially publish the statutory acts of the National Bank in order to provide the commercial banks and the public with normative documents of the National Bank as well as to promote banking legislation of the Kyrgyz Republic.

The periodicity of this publication is assumed to be once a month in the Kyrgyz and Russian languages.

Press Release of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic

The Press Release of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic contains a chronicle of events that take place in the National Bank and in the banking system as a whole, operational information and analytical materials on financial market for a week, other information for mass media and the public.

It is published weekly in the Kyrgyz and Russian languages.



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
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1. THE CURRENT STATE OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

The surplus of the balance of payments increased 3.0 times as compared to the same period of 2006 and made USD 98.0 million. The deficit of the current account in the reporting period was equal to 19.7 per cent of GDP or USD 322.0 million, which 3.5 times exceeded the deficit of the comparable period of 2006.

The foreign trade turnover of the Kyrgyz Republic in the first half of 2007 has made USD 1,673.1 million, against USD 1,074.6 million for the comparable period of 2006.

The amount of trade balance in the first half of 2007 was negative USD 643.8 million, which was

more than twice the trade deficit of the same period of 2006.

Export of goods at f.o.b. prices in the reporting period was USD 514.7 million, having increased by 34.3 per cent as compared to the results of the first half of 2006. At the same time, there was a decrease in the export of gold to non-CIS countries by 13.2 per cent, at the expense of a drop in production of this precious metal. As a whole, without taking the gold into account, the volume of exports increased by 56.8 per cent and made USD 407.6 million.

In the reporting period, the growth in the functional distribution, except for intermediate goods, was observed in the functional structure of exports. Export deliveries of energy products increased almost 3 times, exports of consumer goods increased by 43.8 per cent, exports of raw products grew by 15.7 per cent, and exports of investment goods increased by 10.0 per cent. The volume of intermediate goods exports decreased by 5.8 per cent.

In the first half of 2007, the growth of export was observed both to CIS and non-CIS countries. Their shares in total volume of exports for the reporting period amounted to 45.6 and 54.4 per cent, accordingly.

In the reporting period, Kyrgyzstan exported goods to CIS countries for the amount of USD 231.2 million, which exceeded the exports of the first half of 2006 by 36.9 per cent. The largest trade partners among CIS countries in the reporting period were Russia (44.4 per cent of total volume of exports to CIS countries), Kazakhstan (37.8 per cent), and Uzbekistan (10.0 per cent). The exports to the above countries were represented by following major goods: ready-made garments, rolled glass, vegetables and

fruit, tobacco, cement, Portland cement, milk and dairy products, electric power, electric incandescent lamps, iron-and-steel wastes and scrap.

Export to non-CIS countries in the first half of 2007 made USD 275.9 million against USD 207.0 million in the first half of 2006. The greatest share of Kyrgyz export was to Switzerland (39.0 per cent of the total volume of exports to non-CIS countries), Afghanistan (31.4 per cent), China (7.5 per cent). The goods export to Switzerland was down by 13.4 per cent, and in value terms made USD 107.6 million. This trend was caused by the drop in the production and export of gold. However, Switzerland still remains the largest partner of Kyrgyzstan in export transactions. A significant growth in export deliveries to Afghanistan (3 times) was caused by the increase of re-exported petroleum products volume. In commodity composition of exports to China the superiority belonged to the aluminum articles, skins of cattle, lubricating oils, metallic ores and scrap, which mainly caused the growth of exports to this country by 15.2 per cent.

The import of goods at f.o.b. prices in the first half of 2007 has made USD 1,158.4 million, which was higher than the same index of the first half of 2006 by 67.5 per cent.

According to the functional structure, the growth of import arrivals was observed in all categories of goods. The largest items of import for the reporting period were energy products (31.3 per cent of the total volume of imports), consumer goods (27.4 per cent), and investment goods (21.0 per cent).

In the geographical structure of import the greater share belongs to CIS countries; it made 64.1 per cent. The major partners in import among CIS countries were Russia, Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan, which covered 92.1 per cent of import from CIS countries. The volume of imports from Russia in the first half of 2007 made USD 432.6 million, which exceeded the reference index of 2006 by 65.7 per cent. The imports from Russia mostly included motor


petrol, diesel oil, wood, rubber tires, medicines, and pharmaceutical products. Kazakhstan imported goods for the amount of USD 123.4 million, which was higher than the index for the same period of 2006 by 36.2 per cent. The import from this country was represented by such goods as diesel oil, motor petrol, wheat, tobacco goods. The import from Uzbekistan in the reporting period increased 2 times and made USD 59.7 million. The commodity structure of imports from this country was mainly represented by such goods as natural gas, fertilizers, cement and Portland cement.

The volume of imports from non-CIS countries in the reporting period made USD 375.0 million. The major importing countries were China (35.0 per cent of import volume from non-CIS countries), USA (13.2 per cent), Germany (6.1 per cent), Turkey (5.5 per cent). The above countries mostly imported telecommunication devices and equipment, textile fabrics, inorganic chemical substances, cars and transport equipment, medicaments, poultry meat, various manufactured products.

Balance of services

A deficit in the international services balance in the first half of 2007 increased 1.6 times as compared to the same period of 2006, and made USD 52.7 million. At the same time, both export and import of services increased 1.4 times.

The total volume of services provided for non-residents following the results of the first half of 2007 made USD 217.5 million. Its structure was not subjected to any significant changes: like in 2006, the

predominant part of export fell on items “Transportation Services”, “Travel”, “Business Services” and “Government”.

Transport services export increased by 55.8 per cent as compared to the same period of 2006. Export of services in “Travel” increased 2.4 times against the same period of 2006. The growth in this item was due to the improvement of registration rules in frontier regions, as well as to the development of tourism.

The volume of services import for the reporting period made USD 270.2 million. The most important components of services import, as usual, were transport services, which in reporting period exceeded the index of the first half of 2006 1.9 times and amounted to USD 139.5 million. The maximal share in the total volume of transport services import belonged to the railway transport (85.5 per cent). One more significant component of services import in the first half of 2007 was “Travel”, which increased 1.9 times compared to the similar index of 2006 and made in the reporting period USD 56.6 million.

Income

By the end of the first half of 2007, the net income balance was negative USD 38.4 million, which exceeded the comparable index of 2006 8.5 per cent.

The growth of balance deficit in this item was due to the increase of residents’ expenses on items “Direct Investments Income” and “Other Investments Income”. For instance, as compared to the first half of 2006, the balance deficit of item “Direct Investments Income” increased by 15.9 per cent, making USD 29.9 million. This change was mostly caused by the growth of interest payments on credits extended by direct foreign investors, as well as by the increase of payments on re-invested incomes. The item “Other Investments Income” formed with a positive balance in the amount of USD 1.1 million, which was higher than the same index of 2006 by USD 0.9 million. The growth of this index was caused by the increase of interest incomes paid out for the NBKR assets allocated abroad. At the same time, it is noteworthy that the state foreign debt interest payments forming the part of item “Other Investments Income” increased in the reporting period.


Like in the first half of 2006, the balance of item “Compensation of employees” formed negative

USD 9.6 million, and remained approximately at the same level.

Current transfers

Like before, the positive balance of item “Current transfers” made USD 412.9 million, exceeding the same index of 2006 by 44.5 per cent. The major share in the total volume of current transfers belonged to private transfers: their net inflow increased by 42.6 per cent as compared to the same period of 2006, and made USD 403.1 million. The net inflow of official transfers increased 3.2 times as compared to the reference period and formed in the amount of USD 9.9 million. It is noteworthy that the balance of worker’s remittances considerably exceeded the net export of consumer goods, which in turn formed as a negative amount.

Chart 4: Balance of remittances and Net Export of Consumer Goods




Capital and financial account

In the reporting period, the balance of the **capital and financial account** formed with a surplus of USD 176.4 million, which was by 12.1 per cent lower than the similar index of 2006.

Capital account deficit in the first half of 2007 formed in the amount of USD 50.4 million, exceeding the index of the comparable period of 2006 3.3 times. It is noteworthy that this change, like in the previous years, occurred due to the increase of net outflow in the item “Migrant Transfers”, which was caused by an intensification of migratory processes and migrants’ assets exportation.

By the end of the first half of 2007, the balance

of **financial account** had a surplus of USD 226.8 million. Increase of this index as compared to the first half of 2006 made 4.9 per cent.

The surplus of **direct investments** in the reporting period made USD 79.4 million, which constituted a 1.6 times decrease as compared to the comparable index of 2006, which was mostly caused by the decrease of direct investments inflow to the Kyrgyz Republic. For example, the net inflow to the stock capital in the reporting period decreased 3.2 times. Furthermore, there was an insignificant increase of net inflow to re-invested income by 5.8 per cent as compared to the first half of 2006.

The net inflow in item “Other Capital” amounted to USD 49.5 million, also having decreased 1.7 times as compared to the comparable index of 2006.

As a result of transactions performed by Kyrgyz commercial banks with foreign securities, the net outflow of **portfolio investments** capital for the first half of 2007 made USD 4.7 million, increasing 1.3 times compared to the same index of the first half of 2006. The surplus of **other investments** by the end of the reporting period was USD 152.1 million,

which was a 1.6 times increase as compared to the comparable period of 2006. The formation of this item in the first half of 2007 was considerably influenced by the growth of external liabilities of the Kyrgyz Republic residents along with the increase of external assets.

The net outflow of capital on residents’ external assets for the reporting period made USD 20.4 million, against the inflow of USD 38.4 million in the first half of 2006. This change occurred due to the increase in other assets inflow.

The net inflow of external liabilities for the first half of 2007 made USD 172.6 million, which exceeded the index of the first half of 2006 3.0 times. The net inflow of USD 60.0 million on external liabilities of commercial banks was observed on this item based on credits attracted to private sector. At the same time, the net inflow of external liabilities in the item “Other Liabilities” was down.

In the first half of 2007, the item “**Errors and Omissions**” formed with a surplus of USD 243.6 million against the balance deficit of USD 75.8 million for the comparable period of 2006. The surplus of this item shows that transactions associated with the capital inflow and under-accounting of goods and services export to the Kyrgyz Republic are understated¹.

By the end of the first half of 2007, the net balance of payments had a surplus of USD 98.0 million. The volume of gross international reserves as of the end of reporting period made USD 939.2 million. The coverage ratio of goods and services import by gold and foreign currency reserves was equal to 3.1 months. The volume of net international reserves as of the end of reporting period has made USD 784.1 million. Coverage ratio of goods and services import by net international reserves amounted 2.6 months.

(total, with CIS and non CIS countries)**


