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Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic

"Balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic" is issued by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic. This document reflects last tendencies in external sector development and shows statistical data on the balance of payments, external trade, international reserves, external debt and international investment position, as well as construction methods of balance of payments and informational database. This document is published 4 times a year - in January, May, July and October and has 3 language versions: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

The current edition is amended with the final data for the fourth quarter of 2010 on direct, portfolio investment and trade credits. Data on export of goods for 2010, salaries for the period of 2008-2010 is revised.

Last day for update of data for the present publication is July 20, 2011.

- ... means the absence of data;
- means, that indicators/ratios are equal to 0 (zero) or insignificant;
- is set between years or months (e.g., 1994-1996 or January-June) and means, that all years and months are covered by the shown dates.

Deviations in last digits may occur because of rounding numbers when summing up.

In regard with the possible changes in accounting methods or historical data, which are used in the given document, correction of earlier published data is acceptable. Therefore, 10 years period can be accounted as "open period".

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Annual Report of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic

This document is an overall report of the National Bank for the last year. It includes summary on economic development of the republic and monetary policy, as well as the National Bank financial statements, general information and statistical reviews. It is published in 3 languages: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

Bulletin of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic

Informational publication includes statistical data on the basic macroeconomic indicators and economy sectors of the Kyrgyz Republic. It is published in 3 languages: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

Inflation Report

This publication describes dynamics of consumer prices in the republic and regions, analysis of the main inflation factors, informs about the National Bank decisions on monetary policy and provides with inflation preview for the oncoming period. It is published quarterly in Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

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"Press-release of the National Bank" describes current events, which take place in National Bank and provides with the major data on the financial market. It is published weekly in Kyrgyz and Russian languages.

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
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CURRENT ACCOUNT

As per results of the first quarter of 2011, the current account balance was formed positive in the amount of US\$ 28.0 million. Deficit of the current account constituted 8.9 percent to GDP or US\$ 117.5 million.

in percent to GDP




TRADE BALANCE¹

Deficit of trade balance of the Kyrgyz Republic in the first quarter of 2011 increased by 40.3 percent as compared to the first quarter of 2010 and constituted US\$ 214.7 million.

Increase in the size of the negative trade balance was provided by faster rates of import accumulation as compared to export.

External turnover in FOB prices in the reporting period increased by 9.8 percent in comparison with the first quarter of 2010 and constituted US\$ 1 191.8 million in value terms.

Export of goods in FOB prices (with regard to estimations of the National Statistics Committee and National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic) was formed in the amount of US\$ 488.6 million, having increased by 4.8 percent. Growth of total export was provided by supplies of gold, which increased by 17.3 percent or by US\$ 41.5 million. In the reporting period, export without regard to gold decreased by 8.5 percent and constituted US\$ 207.3 million. In the reporting period, there was increase in re-export of oil products to the CIS countries (by 55.9 percent or US\$ 3.8 million).

According to the functional structure of export, in the reporting period, there was growth on all items of functional distribution, except for raw materials. The largest category of export was accounted for intermediate goods (71.2 percent from the total export), consumer goods (18.6 percent). The share of raw materials decreased by 14.6 percentage points and constituted 2.1 percent from the total export.

Growth of the intermediate goods export constituted 21.7 percent or US\$ 56.2 million in absolute expression. Cost of intermediate goods export reached the level of US\$ 314.9 million, including US\$ 281.3 million, provided by supplies of gold to Switzerland (51.0 percent from the total export volume of gold) and United Arabic Emirates (48.8 percent).

Increase in the gold export cost was due to growth of prices by 23.6 percent, whereas physical volume of supplies decreased by 5.1 percent.

Export of *consumer goods* in the reporting period

increased by 33.8 percent (US\$ by 20.8 million) and constituted US\$ 82.1 million. This increase was mainly due to supplies of vegetables, which increased in 2.8 times as compared to the corresponding period of the past year and constituted US\$ 28.6 million. Moreover, positive tendency was noted for export of clothes and accessories by 12.7 percent. At that, supplies of milk and dairy products decreased by 24.0 percent. Export of vegetables increased mainly to Kazakhstan by US\$ 9.7 million, Russian Federation by US\$ 3.1 million, which is in 2 times more as compared to the first quarter of 2010. Clothes and accessories were mainly exported to Russia for the amount of US\$ 24.9 million, which is by 14.8 percent more as compared to the corresponding period of the past year. In the reporting period there was decrease in export of milk and dairy products to Kazakhstan by 28.3 percent. Export of incandescent electric lamps to the Russian Federation increased by 41.5 percent and constituted US\$ 2.3 million, whereas it decreased to Uzbekistan and Kazakhstan by 39.7 and 36.8 percent correspondingly.

Export of *energy* products increased by 20.7 percent and constituted US\$ 29.3 million. Increase was due to growth of re-export of aviation kerosene by 10.1 percent as a result of prices growth by 31.5 percent, whereas physical volume decreased by 16.3 percent. Supplies of aviation kerosene increased to such countries as Russia (in two times), Turkey (by 35.7 percent). Also, in the reporting period there was increase in export of electric energy to Kazakhstan, cost volume of which increased in 3.4 times or by US\$ 4.8 million. Shares distribution of export of energy products to the CIS and non-CIS countries constituted 60.2 and 39.8 percent correspondingly.

Due to decrease in supplies by 87.0 percent (by 60.9 million US\$), the total volume of export of *raw materials* constituted US\$ 9.1 million. Negative tendency was provided by decrease in export of non-organic chemical substances, export of which was terminated in the first quarter of 2011. In the corresponding period of the past year, export of this product constituted US\$ 61.7 million and occupied 88.1 percent from the total export of raw materials. Also, export of raw materials was affected by decrease in tobacco export to Russia by US\$ 67.6 percent or by 2.1 million.

Export of *investment goods* in the reporting period increased by 11.1 percent and constituted US\$ 6.8 million. According to the goods structure of this category, there was increase in re-export of automobiles, not included into other categories (by US\$ 1.2 million). Shares distribution of export of investment goods to the CIS and non-CIS countries constituted 73.6 and 26.4 percent correspondingly.

Import of goods in FOB prices increased by 13.6 percent and made US\$ 703.2 million.

Main components of import, as before, were consumer goods (40.4 percent from the total volume of import), intermediate goods (21.4 percent) and energy products (19.8 percent)².

Import of *consumer goods* increased by 33.4 percent and constituted US\$ 307.4 million. There was increase in import of medications (in two times) mainly due to humanitarian aid from the United States of America for the amount of US\$ 13.9 million. Supplies of wheat flour and mangcorn flour increased by US\$ 8.4 million; coffee, tea, cocoa and spices - by US\$ 4.5 million; essential oils and perfume substances - by US\$ 4.1 million; meat and meat products - by US\$ 1.2 million. At that, there was considerable decrease in import of fruits and nuts (by 40.9 percent) and rice (by 43.6 percent). There was increase in import of meat and meat products from China - by 56.7 percent (24.8 percent from the total import of mean), clothes and accessories - by 58.9 percent. Negative tendency was noted for import of rice from China (decrease by 79.5 percent as compared to the reporting quarter of the past year). Import of second-hand automobiles from Japan considerably increased (in 2.2 times). Import of medications from the CIS countries, especially from Russia, increased by 34.8 percent; chocolate and other cocoa products - by 45.5 percent. Supplies of wheat flour and mangcorn flour from Kazakhstan

increased by US\$4.6 million, cigarettes and tobacco products - by 27.3 percent.

As per results of the reporting period, import of *intermediate goods* increased by 22.0 percent and constituted US\$ 163.3 million. According to the goods structure of this category, in the reporting period, there was increase in supplies of fertilizers (by 42.3 percent), rubber tires (by 33.4 percent), spare parts for cars (in 2.3 times), plastic materials in primary form (in 2.2 times). At that, there was decrease in export of such goods as: coloring and tanning substances - by 13.4 percent, crude iron and steel - by 3.1 percent, aluminium - by 45.7 percent.

Increase in supplies of fertilizers was mainly due to Uzbekistan (61.6 percent of all supplies). There was increase in import from Russia of intermediate goods, crude iron and steel (by 27.9 percent or US\$ 2.4 million), rubber tires - by 22.0 percent. There was increase in supplies of fabrics from China (by 54.7 percent or US\$ 4.2 million), whereas import of crude iron and steel decreased by 4.3 million US\$.

In the reporting period, import of *energy products* decreased by 22.0 percent and constituted US\$ 150.7 million. The share of oil products in this group of products constituted 78.5 percent, which were mainly supplied by Russia (86.5 percent from the total volume of oil products supply). Growth of prices for imported oil fuel provided decrease in supplies of oil products: aviation kerosene - by 61.0 percent (price increased by 64.4 percent), diesel fuel - by 19.9 percent (price increased by 67.3 percent), automobile gasoline - by 1.3 percent (price increased by 20.6 percent). The volume of import of kerosene, diesel fuel and automobile gasoline in natural value decreased by 76.0, 52.1, 16.0 percent correspondingly. Import of coal decreased by 49.9 percent or by 6.4 million US\$. Import of natural gas increased by 14.4 percent due to growth of prices by 16.5 percent, whereas physical volume decreased by 1.8 percent.

Import of *investment goods* in the reporting period increased by 33.8 percent and constituted 108.0 million US\$. According to the goods structure of this category, there was a considerable increase in import of automobiles, assigned for cargo transportation (in 4.2 times). Moreover, there was increase in supplies

of mechanical shovels, diggers and payloaders (in 5.3 times). 88.7 percent of import of investment goods was provided by non-CIS countries. In the first quarter of 2011, the largest operation in this group of goods was import of automobiles, assigned for cargo transportation from the United States of America, which constituted US\$ 19.3 million. Also, the USA imported machines and equipment for construction for the sum of US\$ 3.7 million.

Import of *raw materials* constituted 32.1 million US\$, which is by 0.6 percent less as compared to the corresponding period of the past year. There was also a considerable decrease in import of other non-organic chemical substances by 88.2 percent or by 12.9 million US\$, supplies of which mainly reduced from Kazakhstan - 85.4 percent.


At that, in the reporting period, there was increase in import of unmilled and mangcorn crops from Kazakhstan in 2.1 times. Almost all amount of imported raw materials was provided by the CIS countries (88.7 percent).

BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

As per results of the first quarter of 2011, the balance of international services was formed negative in the amount of US\$ 62.0 million, which is in 4.1 times more as compared to the corresponding period of 2010. This index was formed as a result of increase in services, received by residents, by 8.7 percent, at simultaneous decrease in services, provided to non-residents, by 15.2 percent.

Turnover of international services decreased by 2.8 percent and constituted US\$ 384.1 million.

Export of services in the first quarter of 2011 decreased by US\$ 28.8 million. This was provided by decrease in export on such items of international services as "transportation services" (by 26.2 percent) and "business services" (by 10.5 percent).

Export of "transportation services" amounted to US\$ 29.6 million, which constitutes 18.4 percent from the total volume of export of services. This decrease was provided by reduction of services, provided to non-residents, by railway and air transportation by 25.2 and 7.7 percent correspondingly.

The volume of export of services on the item "trips" decreased to 66.6 million US\$ and constituted 41.4 percent from the total volume of export of services. At that, there was decrease in provided services on the item "business trips" and "personal trips".

Export of services on the item "business services" decreased to US\$ 30.0 million. The share of this item constituted 18.6 percent in the total volume of export of services. Moreover, there was decrease in insurance services (by 36.3 percent), financial services (by 53.0 percent) and other services (by 34.1 percent), provided to non-residents.

Increase in export was noted on such items as "construction services" (in 13.8 times), "communication services" (in 2.1 times) and "government services" (by 39.0 percent). The share of these items in the total volume of export of services constitutes 9.6 percent.

In the first quarter of 2011, import of services increased from US\$ 205.2 to 223.1 million. The largest influence on formation of import of services was caused by transportation services, which occupy 43.7 percent in the total volume of import of services, as well as services, received by residents during their staying abroad (29.5 percent) and business services (17.1 percent).

Import of transportation services was formed in the amount of US\$ 97.6 million, having increased by 10.9 percent as compared to the corresponding index of 2010. This growth was provided by increase in import of services, provided by air and automobile transportation by 38.0 and 57.4 percent correspondingly.

As for the items "business services" and "other services", increase constituted 66.3 and 27.9 percent correspondingly. Their total share constituted 20.8 percent from the total volume of import of services.

Decrease in volumes of received services was noted on such items as "trips" (by 1.2 percent), "construction services" (by 81.5 percent), "financial services" (by 72.4 percent), "computer and informational services" (by 45.3 percent) and "government services" (by 21.3 percent). There total share constituted 32.5 percent from the total volume of export.

INCOMES

As per results of the first quarter of 2011, negative balance of incomes constituted US\$ 192.3 million, which is by 34.1 percent more as compared to the first quarter of the previous year.

The growth of negative balance of this item was mainly due to increased income of foreign direct investors from performance of investing activities in Kyrgyzstan. Thus, the negative balance of "incomes on direct investment" increased by 40.7 percent and constituted US\$ 176.1 million.

Changes in interest payments on previously received loans by the public sector affected reduction of the negative balance of income on the item "other investments" to US\$ 8.6 million.

During the reporting quarter, the balance of the item "remuneration" was negative in the amount of US\$ 7.7 million; this indicator increased by 6.6 percent as compared to the corresponding period of 2010. This increase was due to excess of income of nonresidents, received from performance of activity in Kyrgyzstan, over the income, received from employment of residents abroad. In this case, it should be noted that accounting on the item, "remuneration" of residents abroad is incomplete.

TRANSFERS

The balance of current transfers in the first quarter of 2011 was formed with a surplus of US\$ 351.5 million, which is by 54.9 percent more as compared to the corresponding period of 2010.

Net inflow of current transfers to the sector of state administration (neutral presentation of the balance of

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payments) increased from US\$ 8.3 to 38.7 million. This increase was mainly due to increase in cash grants, received by the public sector.


Net inflow of current transfers to other sectors (neutral presentation of the balance of payments) amounted to US\$ 312.8 million, having increased by 43.0 percent. The main share of total revenues still accounted for the item "money transfers of workers", which net inflow increased by 37.2 percent (US\$ 79.3 million) for the year.

In its case, remittances through the money transfer systems (91.0 percent) took the largest share in the gross inflow of money transfers of labor migrants.

During the reporting period, the net inflow of money transfers as compared to last year increased by 42.8 percent. At that, geographic structure of money transfers as a whole remained unchanged. In the first quarter of 2011, the main share of transfers was received from the Russian Federation (92.8 percent), United States (2.7 percent), Kazakhstan (2.4 percent) and Germany (1.6 percent). The outflow of money transfers was mainly observed to the Russian Federation (96.9 percent).

The balance of money transfers still covers the net export of consumer goods, which in turn was formed with the deficit in the amount of US\$ 225.2 million.


CAPITAL AND FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS ACCOUNT

As per results of the first quarter of 2011, the balance

of the capital and financial transactions account (in analytical presentation) was formed positive in the amount of US\$ 266.6 million, which is in 6.3 times more as compared to the corresponding index of the first quarter of 2010.

Deficit of the capital transactions account in the first quarter of 2011 was formed in the amount of US\$ 11.4 million, which is in 2.7 times more as compared to the corresponding index of first quarter of 2010.

This item was influenced by transactions, related to movement of the capital of migrants, moving abroad for permanent residence. Thus, on the item "transfers of migrants" there was increase in outflow by 69.6 percent, which constituted US\$ 9.6 million in cost value.

As per results of the reporting quarter, balance of financial account was formed positive in the amount of US\$ 278.0 million against positive value of US\$ 46.6 million in the first quarter of 2010.

On the item "direct investment" there was increase in the surplus, which was caused by inflow of foreign direct investments into the Kyrgyz Republic to 54.2 percent. In the structure of direct investments, the main share accounted for reinvested earnings, which increased by 57.0 percent.

Increase in net inflow of foreign direct investment was developed mainly due to investments from such countries as Canada, China and Kazakhstan. The most attractive economic activities in terms of direct

investors were processing industry, financial activity and trade.

In the reporting period, the item "portfolio investment" was formed positive in the amount of US\$ 5.0 million, whereas the corresponding index of the first quarter of 2010 was negative in the amount of US\$ 73.1 million.

The value of the item "other investments" in the first quarter of 2011 was positive and amounted to US\$ 60.3 million.

In the first quarter of 2011, assets of residents decreased by 57.1 percent, which was due to a slight increase in the volume of cash monetary funds of commercial banks abroad as well as reduced accounts receivable of enterprises.

At that, liabilities of residents to the "outside world" during the reporting period increased by 39.8 percent compared to the corresponding period of 2010 and constituted US\$115.2 million.

External liabilities of the country were formed under the influence of reducing of the amount of cash and deposits of nonresidents in the banking sector by US\$ 5.2 million and decrease in credits volume by 45.0 percent.

As per results of the first quarter of 2011, net inflow

of credits into the public sector constituted US\$ 22.2 million, which was by 14.9 percent less as compared to the corresponding index of 2010. This decrease was provided by reduction of the attracted credits volume by 13.7 percent. Net position on the item "credits to the private sector" in the reporting period was formed positive in the amount of US\$ 2.3 million, whereas the corresponding index of 2010 constituted US\$ 18.5 million. Another tendency was provided by decrease in inflow of credits by 19.8 percent and increase in aggregate payments on servicing of obligations of the private sector to foreign investors by 65.8 percent.

Accounts Payable of enterprises to non-residents as per results of the first quarter of 2011 was formed in the amount of US\$ 95.9 million against negative value of US\$ 0.3 million in the first quarter of 2010.

The item "**Errors and omissions**" was formed negative in the amount of US\$ 121.1 million, which testifies about undercount of operations, related to outflow of capital from the republic or undercount of import of goods and services.

The volume of gross international reserves as of the end of the first quarter of 2011 constituted US\$ 1 802.4 million. Coefficient of coverage with gold and foreign exchange reserves of future import of goods and services constituted 4.1 months.


Chart I.1 Real and Nominal Effective Exchange Rate Indices
