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### ***Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic***

"Balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic" is issued by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic. The legislative basis for the balance of payments are the Law of the Kyrgyz Republic as of July 29, 1997 No. 59 "On the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic" and the Resolution of the Government of the Kyrgyz Republic as of November 3, 2000 No. 645 "On measures to improve statistics of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic". This document reflects last tendencies in external sector development and shows statistical data on the balance of payments, external trade, international reserves, external debt and international investment position, as well as construction methods of balance of payments and informational database. This document is published 4 times a year in January, May, July and October and has 3 language versions: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

**Last day for update of data for the present publication is January 20, 2016.**

- means, that indicators/ratios are equal to 0 (zero) or insignificant;
- is set between years or months (e.g., 1994-1996 or January-June) and means, that all years and months are covered by the shown dates.

Deviations in last digits may occur because of rounding numbers when summing up.

In regard with the possible changes in accounting methods or historical data, which are used in the given document, correction of earlier published data is acceptable. Therefore, 10 years period can be accounted as "open period".

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## **Other publications of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic**

### ***Annual Report of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic***

This document is an overall report of the National Bank for the last year. It includes summary on economic development of the republic and monetary policy, as well as the National Bank financial statements, general information and statistical reviews. It is published in 3 languages: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

### ***Bulletin of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic***

Informational publication includes statistical data on the basic macroeconomic indicators and economy sectors of the Kyrgyz Republic. It is published in 3 languages: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

### ***Monetary Policy Report (Inflation Report of the Kyrgyz Republic)***

This publication describes dynamics of consumer prices in the republic and regions, analysis of the main inflation factors, informs about the National Bank decisions on monetary policy and provides with inflation preview for the forthcoming period. It is published quarterly in Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

### ***Report on Stability of the Financial Sector of the Kyrgyz Republic***

The report reflects the NBKR's evaluation of foreign and domestic economic factors influencing the financial stability, the conditions of banks and other financial intermediate institutions, as well as the analysis of the current state of affairs in the financial markets and the stability of financial sector of Kyrgyzstan. It is published twice a year in Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

### ***Statutory Acts of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic***

The purpose of the document is to publish statutory acts of the National Bank in order to provide commercial banks and public with statutory acts and official information on the National Bank activity, as well as propaganda of the Kyrgyz Republic banking legislation. Presumable publication frequency is once a month in Kyrgyz and Russian languages.

### ***Press-Release of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic***

"Press-release of the National Bank" describes current events, which take place in National Bank and provides with the major data on the financial market. It is published weekly in Kyrgyz and Russian languages.

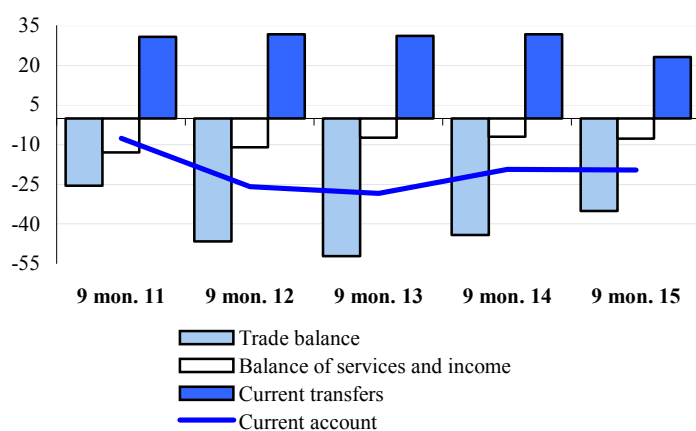

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## THE CURRENT STATE OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

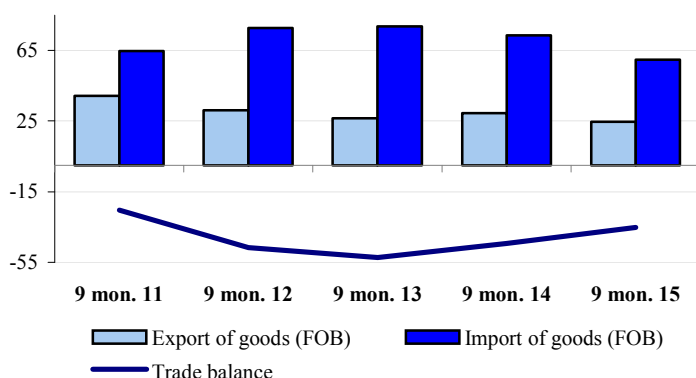
**Chart 1. Current account***in percents to GDP*

According to the results for nine months of 2015, the current account deficit made 20.6 percent to GDP<sup>1</sup> against a decrease in the trade deficit and decline in the volume of money transfers.

According to the estimates of the National Bank, the current account deficit with regard to the NBKR additional estimates<sup>2</sup> amounted to 15.2 percent to GDP.

**TRADE BALANCE**

According to the results for nine months of 2015, reduction in the deficit of the trade balance was due to a more significant decrease in exports compared to a decline in imports.

At the end of nine months of 2015, the **trade balance** of the Kyrgyz Republic decreased by 33.8 percent against the comparable indicator of 2014 to form negative balance in the amount of USD 1,581.9 million.

**External trade turnover** in FOB prices decreased by 19.6 percent in the reporting period and made USD 4,011.6 million.

Reduced consumer demand due to a general slowdown of economic growth in the countries-major trade partners of the Kyrgyz Republic conditioned decrease in total exports at the end of nine months of 2015. Thus, **export of goods in FOB prices** including additional

estimates of the NSC and the National Bank decreased by 6.6 percent compared to the indicator of nine months of 2014 and amounted to USD 1,214.8 million (64.7 percent to GDP). Negative dynamics of export was due to significant decrease in export of raw materials and consumer goods, despite an increase in the supply of gold. In January-September of the current year, **export excluding gold** decreased by 22.4 percent against the comparable indicator of nine months of 2014 to make USD 696.9 million. A decrease was primarily due to a reduction in supplies of such groups as "clothes and clothing accessories, vegetables, fruits and aircraft fuel", exported as board stocks.

**Export excluding gold and re-export** decreased by 18.3 percent and amounted to USD 621.6 million.

The significant share in the export structure according to the SITC items was still accounted for the group "goods and transactions not included in other categories of SITC". Increase in the specific weight of this group up to 53.4 percent was due to growth in the supply of gold. A decrease in the specific weight of the group "miscellaneous manufactured articles" and "food products and live animals" affected decline in the value of the main positions of these groups, such as clothes and clothing accessories, vegetables and fruits. Decrease in the specific weight of the group "industrial goods, classified by type of materials" was due to a decline in the volume of supplies of rolling glass, rubber tires, steel and cast iron.

The composition of major export positions compared to the previous year was virtually unchanged and included the most significant goods of the **manufacturing industry** (metallurgy, textile and clothing industry) and **agriculture**.

In January-September 2015 in the production of metallurgical products an increase in the output volumes (by 38.3 percent) was due to the growth of production and processing of precious metals<sup>3</sup>. This factor affected an increase in gold exports by 28.7 percent compared with the previous year. An increase in the value of gold exports was mainly due to a growth in the physical volume by 36.9 percent with decrease in contract prices by 6.0 percent<sup>4</sup>.

There was a decline in supplies of the rest products of metallurgical industry, except for silver, platinum and other metals of the platinum group. A significant reduction in supplies was observed in the "cast iron and steel" group.

Output of textile fabrics and clothes<sup>5</sup> decreased as compared to January-September 2014. A decline in the textile production, along with a decrease of purchasing power in the major export markets influenced a decline in exports of clothes and clothing accessories in January-September of the current year by 51.0 percent (by USD 41.3 million). A reduction of the value and physical volume was observed in all commodity groups. Meanwhile, the most significant reduction in the supplies was observed in "articles of textile fabrics for women and girls" item (by 49.3 percent or USD 24.0 million).

In January-September 2015, an increase in the volumes of gross output of **agricultural products** by 1.6 percent was primarily due to increased production of grain, vegetables and potatoes, as well as livestock products<sup>6</sup>. Despite this fact, there was a significant decrease in the exports of the major products of the livestock breeding and plant industry. A decline in exports of vegetables and dairy products resulted from reduction in the physical quantity of supplies and export prices. In January-September of the current year, the decreased value of exported fruits and nuts was due to a significant decline in the physical quantity of exports (by 58.8 percent) with increase in the average contract prices by 36.2 percent. Moreover, during the reporting period, there was a decrease in exports of cotton, live animals, meat and meat products mainly due to lower export prices.

In January-September 2015, the specific weight of the registered re-export<sup>7</sup> in the total volume of export decreased from 10.6 to 6.2 percent. A decrease in the re-export was primarily due to a reduction in the supplies on the "other inorganic chemicals" item, the exports thereof declined by 60.5 percent or USD 19.1 million. There was reduction primarily in the supplies of the goods from this group, except for the "mechanical shovels, excavators and shovel loaders" and "food products" items.

**In the geographical structure**, the share of the non-CIS countries was the most significant, exports to these countries increased up to 53.8 percent and amounted to USD 654.0 million in January-September 2015. An increase in export of gold to Switzerland had an impact on an increase of its share up to 35.8 percent. In the structure of exports to the non-CIS countries, the major share was accounted for the supplies of precious metals followed by the supplies of agricultural products. Turkey was the main trade partner; it exported the major share of agricultural products.

In January-September 2015, the share of the EEU countries made 37.8 percent. Despite a decline in export volumes, the geographical distribution of certain types of goods shows that, except for gold, the main sales markets for domestic goods are in the EEU countries. At the same time, the level of geographic concentration with regard to many exported goods remained high.

In general, during the reporting period, the Kyrgyz Republic exported goods to 86 countries of the world (in January-September 2014 exports were made to 83 countries).

**Import of goods** in FOB prices according to the results of January-September 2015 constituted USD 2,796.7 million and decreased by 24.2 percent as compared to January-September 2014.

In January-September 2015, the goods of "mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials" group prevailed **in the commodity structure** of imports. Due to the significant reduction in the volume of imported goods of other groups, the share of this group increased by 1.5 percent and made 21.6 percent. The main share in this group is given to petroleum products.

During the reporting period, the volume of imported petroleum products decreased by 26.0 percent. This decrease was due to the decline of average contractual prices by 43.1 percent, with an increase in the physical quantity of import by 29.9 percent. Decrease in the value of imported petroleum products was mainly due to reduced supplies of gasoline and diesel fuel, the total value of import thereof decreased by 28.1 percent (by USD163.4 million in absolute terms). At the same time, supplies of fuel oil increased by 38.3 percent or USD 13.5 million.

Reduction in imports of used cars, total imports of which decreased by 98.9 percent or USD 63.9 million compared to the corresponding indicators of the previous year caused a decrease in the share of the "machinery and transport equipment" group down to 19.8 percent. At the same time import volumes of such items as "linear electrical apparatus for telephony or telegraphy", "motor cars and other motor vehicles designed for transportation of people", "road tractors for semi-trailers" and other goods decreased.

Insignificant increase in imports was observed on the items "automatic data processing equipment and their units", and "vehicles for construction and mining industry".

The specific weight of manufactured goods, classified by type of material, increased by 1.1 percentage point and made 18.6 percent of the total volume of imported goods. The most significant products in this group is the "iron and steel" item, imports of which in the reporting period decreased by 17.7 percent compared to the same period of 2014. The significant products of this group also include textile fabrics, rubber tires, various paper products and metals, as well as construction materials. There was a decrease in the value of many products of this group due to a reduction in the physical quantity and decrease in import prices.

**In the geographical distribution** of the import, the share of imports of goods from the Eurasian Economic Union countries increased from 45.0 percent to 49.0 percent. Respectively, the share of other countries constituted 51.0 percent.

Fuel and energy and food products are among the major goods imported from the EEU countries. The Russian Federation was the main supplier of fuel and lubricants; electric energy and coal were supplied from the Republic of Kazakhstan. Basic foodstuffs such as cereals and their products, sugar, vegetable oils and other food products were also imported primarily from the EEU countries.

Despite a significant decrease of the value, the main share in the structure of imports from the non-CIS countries fell within the "road vehicles" and "clothes and clothing accessories" groups.

Generally, in the reporting period, goods were imported to the Kyrgyz Republic from 134 countries of the world (in January-September 2014 – from 138 countries).

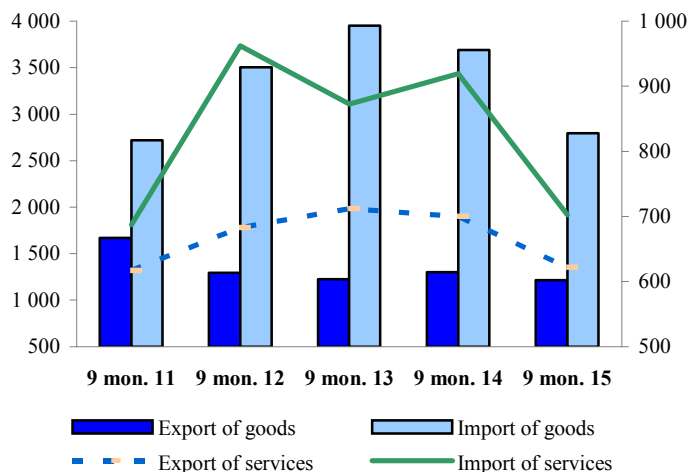

## BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

Along with a decrease in the foreign trade activity of the Kyrgyz Republic, the volume of international services declined as well.

**Chart 3. External service and goods trade\***

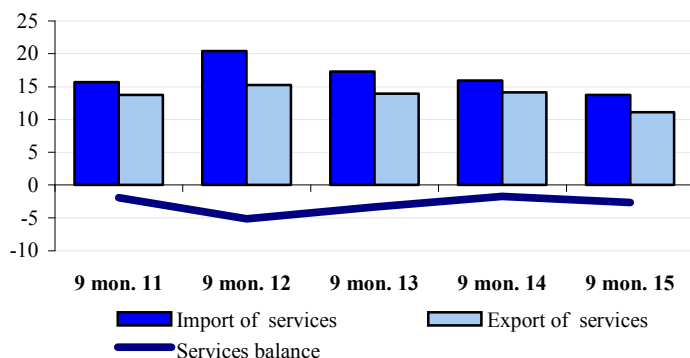
(In millions of USD)

At the end of period from January to September 2015, the level of international services decreased by 18.2 percent, having reached the level of USD 1,324.3 million.

**Balance of international services** was found negative and constituted USD 80.5 million, which is by 63.3 percent lower than the deficit of the balance of services in the corresponding period of 2014. At the same time, the import of services decreased by 23.6 percent, meanwhile, the volume of services rendered by the residents of the Kyrgyz Republic decreased by 11.2 percent.

In the reporting period, the **export of services** was found at the level of USD 621.9 million, which corresponds to 51.2 percent of the volume of exported goods. **Import of services** constituted USD 702.4 million, which constituted 25.1 percent of the imported goods.

In the reporting period, the main services traditionally included "transport services" and "travels and business services" that in total accounted for 80.0 percent of the international services.

The balance of transport services in January-September 2015 was found negative and made USD 216.5 million, having decreased by 34.6 percent against January-September 2014. Thus, the export of transport services increased by 16.9 percent, while, the import decreased by 21.7 percent. An increase in the

volume of transport services rendered by the non-residents was due to a growth in the export of motor car transport services by 4.0 times. Decrease in the import of railway transport services by 15.1 percent, air transport services by 34.3 percent and motor car transport services by 35.0 percent, rendered by the residents of the country resulted in the reduction of the total volume of imported transport services.

The balance of the "travels" item was found with the surplus in the amount of USD 128.0 million, having increased by 5.6 times against the comparable indicator for nine months of 2014. A decrease was observed in the export of services (decrease by 1.4 percent) and the services rendered to the citizens of the Kyrgyz Republic (decrease by 35.3 percent).

Net export of "business services" within the reporting period was found positive and constituted USD 22.1 million, having decreased by 41.2 percent as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. Deterioration of the indicators on "business services" was due to the significant decrease in the export of such services compared to the import. The main factor that affected the decrease in the export of business services was a decrease in the consultation services provided by the residents of the Kyrgyz Republic. Decrease in the import of the given services is primarily due to the reduction in the import of architectural, engineering and technical services, as well as the services of mining industry.

## INCOME

*Dynamics of the "incomes" item was mainly defined by the change in the volume of incomes of direct foreign investors.*

In January-September 2015, the balance of the item "income" was found negative in the amount of USD 252.8 million, having increased by 30.5 percent against the similar indicator of nine months of 2014.

This trend was mainly based on the increase in the income of direct foreign investors by 44.4 percent due to an increase in the volumes of re-invested profit of the enterprises from 123.8 to USD 189.6 million (increase by 53.1 percent). The volume of distributed income of the companies-residents in the form of dividends in favor of foreign direct investors decreased by 59.1 percent and constituted USD 4.3 million.

In the reporting period, the volume of interest payments on previously obtained credits increased by 5.9 percent and amounted to USD 58.3 million due to a growth in payments on credits to the private and the public sector. At the same time, there was a reduction in the volume of "other income" received by the residents of the country on other investments from USD 12.7 to USD 13.6 million. In general, such situation resulted in an increase of the deficit in the "incomes on other investments" item by 5.5 percent (up to USD 44.7 million).

In January-September 2015, the balance of the "remuneration" item was also found negative in the amount of USD 14.3 million (decrease by 16.7 percent), which resulted from a decrease in the aggregate volume of income earned by the non-residents as a result of their labor activity in the Kyrgyz Republic.

## TRANSFERS

*Incomes on the "current transfers" item decreased mainly due to a reduction in the inflow of money transfers from the migrant workers.*

At the end of nine months of 2015, positive balance of **current transfers** amounted to USD 1,193.1 million, which was by 28.3 percent lower against the comparable period of the previous year.

**Private transfers** (other sectors) had a controlling influence on the account of current transfers; their net inflow decreased by 28.1 percent to make USD 1,135.8 million. In the structure of private transfers, as before, the defining role had the money transfers of the workers, the specific weight thereof in the gross volume of incoming private transfers constituted 97.7 percent. In the reporting period, decrease in the gross volume of transfers received by 28.1 percent was due to the reduction in the inflow thereof by 25.4 percent, whereas, the outflow of transfers decreased by 11.6 percent.

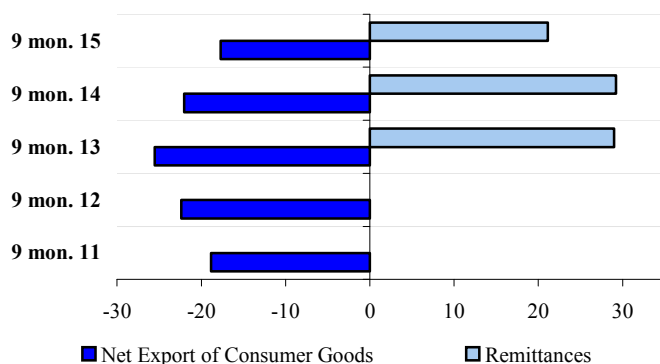

The main way of making labor migrants' money transfers to the country is via the money transfer systems<sup>8</sup>. In January-September of the current year, net inflow of funds transferred via the money transfer systems amounted to USD 1,008.8 million<sup>9</sup>, having decreased by 28.2 percent against the same indicator of the previous year. Meanwhile, the geographical structure of money transfers remained almost unchanged. In the reporting period, the main share of money transfers was from the Russian Federation (96.4 percent). The share of other countries was considerably lower: 0.5 percent was received from Kazakhstan, and 1.7 percent was received from the USA. In terms of money transfers made from the Kyrgyz Republic, the prevailing share fell on the Russian Federation (95.9 percent) as well.

Money transfers are one of the sources of financing the trade deficit. The balance of transfers still covered net export of consumer goods, which in turn formed with a negative value of USD 542.1 million.

In January-September 2015, the balance of current transfers to the sector of state governance was positive in the amount of USD 57.3 million, having decreased by 31.8 percent against the same indicator of the same period of 2014. The amount of cash grants received by the public sector amounted to USD 59.6 million, USD 30.0 million thereof was the grant of the Russian Federation to the country provided in the first quarter of 2015 in order to

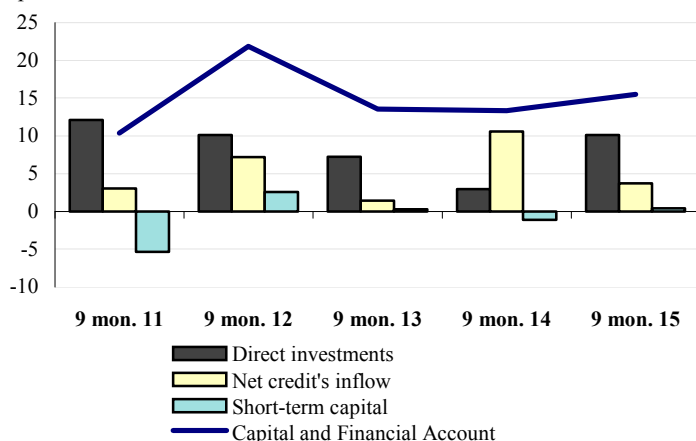
support the budget. The volume of paid membership fees to the international organizations in the reporting period increased by 8.1 percent and amounted to USD 2.4 million.

## CAPITAL AND FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS ACCOUNT

According to the results of nine months of 2015, the capital and financial transactions account was found with a positive balance in the amount of USD 718.5 million, having increased by 9.1 percent against the corresponding indicator of the similar period of 2014.

The balance of the capital transactions account was found positive in the amount of USD 58.9 million, which is by 59.9 percent higher than the level achieved in January-September of 2014. An increase in the indicators of the reporting period was due to the growth of capital transfers received in the form of grants.

Financial account according to the results of nine months of 2015 was found with a positive balance in

the amount of USD 659.6 million, having increased by 6.1 percent against January-September 2014. The most significant inflow of funds in the reporting period was observed on the "other investments" item.

In the reporting period, the balance on the "other investments"<sup>10</sup> item developed with a positive value in the amount of USD 521.7 million against USD 122.4 million according to the results of January-September 2014. The main impact on the dynamics of this item was made by an increase in the inflow of funds invested in the share capital up to USD 551.8 million. In the reporting period, net inflow of the reinvested incomes increased by 53.1 percent and amounted to USD 189.6 million.

In the reporting period, by type of economic activity, the highest net inflow of direct investments was observed on the enterprises engaged in the sphere of financial intermediation and insurance, professional, scientific and technological activities. In the geographical structure of direct investment the prevailing inflow was from Canada and the Russian Federation.

At the end of the period from January to September 2015, net funds attracted to the country on the "other investments" item developed with a positive value in the amount of USD 105.6 million against USD 440.0 million at the end of January-September of 2014.

The main impact on the dynamics of this item was made by a decrease in the net inflow of funds on the liabilities by 71.9 percent, due to reduction in the volume of external loans attracted to the economy primarily by the private sector.

In the reporting period, net flow of loans developed with a positive balance and amounted to USD 147.1 million.

Gross inflow of loans to the public sector decreased by 76.6 percent and amounted to USD 92.0 million. Payments of the official sector on the principal debt of previously received loans formed in the amount of USD 54.8 million in the reporting period. As a result, the net amount of loans received by the state amounted to USD 37.2 million.

In the reporting period, payments in the private sector for servicing previously issued loans increased by 13.2 percent (USD 263.9 million), while loan inflows amounted to USD 373.8 million, having decreased by 17.0 percent. As a result, net flow of loans to the private sector developed in the amount of USD 109.9 million, having decreased by 49.4 percent against the corresponding level of the similar period in the previous year.

The volume of accounts payable of the resident enterprises increased by USD 26.5 million in the reporting period. In general, the dominant share in the total amount of accounts payable was given to the enterprises of wholesale and retail trade, manufacturing industry, construction, and the enterprises engaged in the supply of electricity and data communication, which together account for 74.2 percent of the total debt.

In the reporting period, the assets of residents increased by USD 96.6 million mainly due to an increase in the assets of commercial banks located abroad by USD 119.7 million. However, the amount of accounts receivable decreased by USD 24.7 million. Late in September 2015, over 74.5 percent of the gross accounts receivable was accounted for the enterprises of the manufacturing industry, wholesale and retail trade, the entities engaged in the supply of electricity and gas, as well as professional, scientific and technical activities.

In the reporting period, the assets of residents placed on their accounts in foreign banks decreased by USD 2.6 million. At the end of September 2015, more than 90.0 percent of the total balances of funds on the accounts of enterprises outside the country were accounted for the enterprises of the manufacturing industry.

At the end of nine months of 2015, the **overall balance of payments** was negative to make USD 28.4 million. The balance of the "errors and omissions" item was positive in the amount of USD 3.7 million.

The volume of gross international reserves amounted to USD 1,795.9 million late in March 2015, which covered 3.9 months of future import of goods and services.

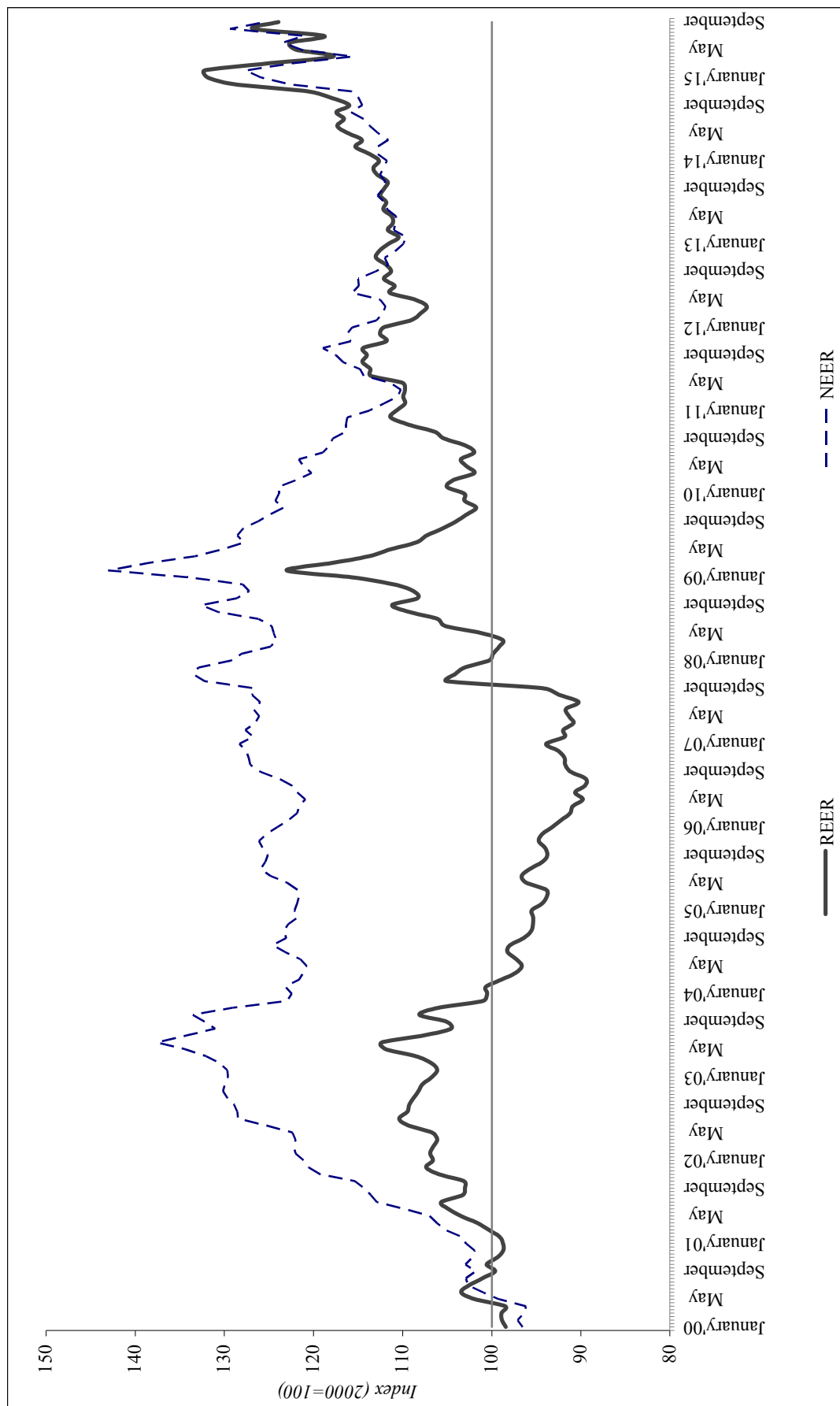
