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Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic

"Balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic" is issued by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic. This document reflects last tendencies in external sector development and shows statistical data on the balance of payments, external trade, international reserves, external debt and international investment position, as well as construction methods of balance of payments and informational database. This document is published 4 times a year - in January, May, July and October and has 3 language versions: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

- is set between years or months (e.g., 1994-1996 or January-June) and means, that all years and months are covered by the shown dates.

In regard with the possible changes in accounting methods or historical data, which are used in the given document, correction of earlier published data is acceptable. Therefore, 10 years period can be accounted as "open period".

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
CURRENT STATE OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

In the first quarter of 2012, the total **balance of payments** developed negative in the amount of USD 5.5 million.

The **current account** deficit amounted to 10.5 percent of GDP, or USD 372.5 million.

in percent to GDP




THE TRADE BALANCE¹

The **trade balance** deficit of the Kyrgyz Republic in the first quarter of 2012 increased in 2.5 times compared to the first quarter of 2011 and constituted USD 531.4 million. Increase of the negative balance of trade balance is associated with an increase in import and a decrease in export.

External trade turnover in FOB prices in the reporting period increased by 17.7 percent compared to the first quarter 2011 and constituted USD 1,402.0 million in value terms.

The export of goods in FOB prices (including estimations of the NSC and the NBKR) constituted USD 435.3 million, having decreased by 10.8 percent. The decrease in export was caused by reduced supplies of gold, which fell by 56.3 percent or USD 158.5 million in absolute terms. Export excluding gold in the reporting period increased by 51.2 percent and amounted to USD 312.4 million.

The decrease of gold production had an impact on the decrease in the share of intermediate goods in total exports up to 45.3 percent (71.3 percent in the first quarter of last year). The growth of share of the remaining items on the functional distribution took place both at the expense of reducing the share of intermediate goods, and increasing in the value of items. Thus, the share of consumer goods constituted 21.4 percent (an increase by 2.8 percentage points), the proportion of raw materials increased by 15.4 percentage points and constituted 17.5 percent of the total exports. The share of energy products and capital goods amounted to 9.4 and 6.4 percent respectively.

The decrease in export of intermediate goods amounted to 44.1 percent or USD 139.0 million, in absolute terms, reaching USD 175.9 million, of which USD 122.8 million account for the supply of gold to Switzerland. Reduction of the value of gold exports was caused by the reduction in the actual volume by 64.2 percent, while prices increased by 22.1 percent.

Exports of *consumer goods* in the reporting period

rose slightly compared with the indicator of last year and constituted USD 83.0 million. The greater part of exports traditionally consisted of clothes and clothing accessories (USD 26.8 million) and fresh, frozen or canned vegetables (USD 18.3 million). Clothes and clothing accessories were mainly exported to Russia in the amount of USD 24.3 million and to Kazakhstan in the amount of USD 2.5 million. Reduction in the supply of legumes to Turkey for USD 6.3 million, and fresh vegetables to Russia for USD 3.9 million was caused by the reduction of exports of fresh, chilled, frozen or canned vegetables by 35.9 percent. In the reporting period, there was an increase in exports of fruits and nuts for USD 5.3 million and dairy products for 2.0 USD million to Kazakhstan. Exports of filament lamps to Kazakhstan increased by USD 0.6 million, while their exports to Russia and Uzbekistan have decreased by USD 1.0 and 0.2 million, respectively.

Exports of *energy products* increased by 24.5 percent and constituted USD 36.6 million. The increase was due to growth in the export of kerosene as on-board resources by 76.7 percent due to an increase in physical volume by 55.4 percent and an increase in prices by 13.7 percent. Supplies of kerosene have increased to such countries as Russia (by 76.6 percent) and Turkey (57.4 percent). Also, in the reporting period, there was an increase in electricity exports to Uzbekistan, the cost volume of which amounted to USD 7.8 million. However, the supply of electricity in Kazakhstan fell by USD 7.0 million. Equity ratio of exports of energy products to CIS and non-CIS countries constituted 53.9 and 46.1 percent, respectively.

The total volume of exports of *raw materials* was formed at the level of USD 67.9 million, having increased by USD 58.8 million. The positive trend was caused by the increase in exports of inorganic chemical substances, whose exports increased by USD 53.9 million in the first quarter of 2012. The bulk of exports (97.4 percent) of inorganic chemical substances were supplied to Kazakhstan. Also, the exports of raw materials were affected by the increase of exports of tobacco in 2.2 times or USD 1.2 million and cotton in 3.1 times or USD 8.8 million.

Exports of *investment goods* in the reporting period

increased in 4.0 times and constituted USD 25.0 million. According to the commodity structure of this category, there was an increase in re-exports of cars for transportation of goods by USD 6.5 million and aircrafts and associated equipment by USD 6.4 million. Equity ratio of exports of investment goods to CIS and other countries amounted to 73.6 and 26.4 percent, respectively.

Imports of goods in FOB prices rose by 37.4 percent and constituted USD 966.7 million. The growth of the cost value of imports was mainly due to an increase in the supply of petroleum products by 85.7 percent, or USD 102.7 million in absolute terms.

The main components of imports, as before, were consumer goods (35.1 percent of total imports), energy products (25.4 percent) and intermediate goods (22.5 percent)².

Imports of *consumer goods* increased by 19.7 percent and constituted USD 368.1 million. This trend is explained by an increase in supply of used cars (in 2.8 times), vegetable oils and fats (by USD 4.0 million), cereal products and products made from flour or starch (by USD 2.3 million), cigarettes containing tobacco (by USD 2.0 million), coffee, tea and cocoa (by USD 0.1 million). At the same time, there was a significant decrease in imports of medicaments by USD 8.3 million, meat and meat products by USD 3.5 million, and sugar, molasses and honey by USD 3.1 million. Imports of meat and meat products and clothes and clothing accessories from China decreased by USD 1.9 million and 0.6 million, respectively. The positive trend was observed for the import of fruits and nuts from China (an increase by USD 0.3 million). Imports of used cars mainly increased from Japan in 2.4 times to USD 29.2 million. Imports of medicines and meat and meat products from the USA decreased by USD 14.1 million and

USD 3.0 million, respectively. From the CIS countries, namely from Russia, imports of medical and pharmaceutical products increased by USD 1.6 million. Supplies of mangcorn flour and cigarettes containing tobacco from Kazakhstan increased by USD 3.5 million and USD 1.9 million, respectively.

Based on the results of the reporting period, imports of *intermediate goods* increased by 44.5 percent and were formed at the level of USD 235.9 million. According to the commodity structure of this category, in the reporting period, supply of iron and steel increased by USD 15.2 million, fertilizers - by USD 13.2 million, plastics in the primary form - by USD 5.9 million, rubber tires - by USD 4.4 million, parts and accessories of cars - by USD 2.9 million. At the same time, there was a reduction in imports of goods such as fabrics, woven, of man-made textile materials by USD 3.3 million. The increase in supply of fertilizers, to a greater extent, was observed by imports from Russia and Uzbekistan (3.7 and 1.5 times, respectively). In addition, from Russia, there was an increase in imports of iron and steel by 84.8 percent or USD 9.5 million. The increase in imports of rubber tires is caused by the growth of imports from Japan in 2.0 times or by USD 3.1 million in absolute terms. From China, there was a decrease in the supply of fabrics of synthetic textile materials (28.1 percent or USD 3.4 million).

Imports of *energy products* in the reporting period increased by 76.4 percent and constituted USD 266.6 million. The share of petroleum products in this commodity group constituted 83.4 percent, whose main supplier traditionally was Russia. Growth in imports of petroleum products was caused by the abolition of export duties on light petroleum products imported from the Russian Federation to the Kyrgyz Republic. In the reporting period, there was an increase in cost volumes of imports of following petroleum products: gasoline - in 2.2 times (due to growth of physical volume in 1.9 times), diesel fuel - in 2.9 times (due to growth of physical volume in 3.2 times). At the same time, there was a decrease in imports of kerosene by 7.5 percent (by reducing the physical volume of supplies by 18.5 percent).

Imports of *investment goods* in the reporting period increased by 30.9 percent and constituted USD 141.0 million. According to the commodity structure of this category, there was a significant increase in imports of aircrafts and related equipment (in 9.0 times), electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy - by 18.2 percent, tools for use in hand and in machine - by 81.6 percent. As a result of reducing the supply of vehicles for the transportation of goods and special purpose vehicles by USD 19.3 million in a given category of commodities, there was a 33.7 percent decrease. In the first quarter of 2012, the largest operation in the group of investment goods was the import of electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy from China, which constituted USD 15.0 million. 82.8 percent of imports of investment goods were provided by foreign countries.

Imports of *raw materials* constituted USD 38.1 million, which 19.5 percent more than the indicator in the comparable period last year. Mainly, the imports of other inorganic chemical substances increased in 3.8 times or by USD 4.9 million, supplies of which increased mainly from Kazakhstan. In the period, there was a reduction of imports of other wheat and unmilled mangcorn from Kazakhstan by 19.9 percent. Russian imports of wood of coniferous species sawn lengthwise increased by USD 22.6 million. Imports of meat and meat products decreased from China and the USA by 37.7 and 21.2 percent, respectively. Almost the entire volume of imported raw materials was provided by the CIS countries (85.3 percent).


THE BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

The turnover of international services for the first quarter of 2012 increased by 60.0 percent, reaching USD 614.6 million.

The deficit of the balance of international services constituted USD 124.0 million, having increased over the same index of 2011 in 2.0 times. It was caused by the outpacing growth in imports of services (65.5 percent) compared with an increase in their exports (52.4 percent).

In the first quarter of the reporting year, **exports of services** formed in the amount of USD 245.3 million, having increased by 52.4 percent. In the reporting period, the volume of services rendered to foreigners during their stay on the territory of the Kyrgyz Republic grew by 88.9 percent or by USD 59.1 million, which had a major impact on the trend of exports. There was increase in the volume of business services (59.3 percent or USD 17.8 million), transport services (37.8 percent or USD 11.2 million), and other services (6.5 percent or USD 1.2 million). The reduction in exports of services was observed under construction services (by 61.5 percent or USD 5.3 million) and communication services (by 14.4 percent or USD 0.6 million).

The structure of exports of services for the reporting period has remained almost unchanged. The largest export position still remains travel, occupying 51.2 percent of the total services rendered. A significant share was occupied by business services (19.5 percent), transportation services (16.6 percent) and other services (8.2 percent).

In the geographical structure of exports, there is an increase in the share of CIS countries from 54.7 percent to 66.8 percent (mainly due to growth in exports to Kazakhstan and the Russian Federation). Accordingly, the share of non-CIS countries decreased, reaching 33.2 percent of total exports.

Imports of services in the reporting period increased by 65.5 percent and formed in the amount of USD 369.3 million. The dynamic growth of imports

was achieved by the growth of services related to travel (by 88.4 percent or USD 58.2 million), business services (in 2.3 times or by USD 50.2 million), and transportation services (by 33.1 percent or USD 32.3 million). At the same time, there was reduction in communication services (by 68.7 percent or USD 2.3 million), financial services (by 12.0 percent or USD 0.2 million), and government services (by 7.9 percent or USD 0.2 million).

In the first quarter of 2012, there was a decrease in the share of transport services from 43.7 to 35.2 percent of total imports of services. At the same time, the share of travel (33.6 percent) and business services (23.9 percent). The share of all other items of imports in total amounted to only 7.3 percent.

Geographical distribution of imports of services in the reporting period has not changed: the share of CIS countries remained at 56.1 percent, non-CIS countries - 43.9 percent. Among the CIS countries the main providers are traditionally the Russian Federation and Kazakhstan (27.3 and 10.2 percent, respectively).

INCOME

Based on the results of the first quarter of 2012, the negative balance of income constituted USD 67.3 million, which is 64.9 percent less than in the first quarter of 2011.

This trend is mainly caused by the reduction of income of foreign direct investors from investing activities in Kyrgyzstan. Thus, the deficit under "direct investment income" decreased by 69.6 percent and constituted USD 53.4 million.

Increase in other income of residents abroad by USD 1.7 million (in 3.8 times) had an effect on the reduction of negative balance of the "other investments" item by USD 6.7 million. At the same time, the payment of interest on loans previously received increased by 4.5 percent and constituted USD 9.0 million.

In the reporting quarter, the balance of the "compensation of employees" item was negative in the amount of USD 7.1 million and this figure decreased by 6.8 percent compared to the same period in 2011. This trend is caused by a decrease in income of non-residents from working in Kyrgyzstan. It should be noted that the accounting of the

"compensation of employees" item" of residents abroad is hard to estimate.

TRANSFERS


The balance of **current transfers** in the first quarter of 2012 was formed with a positive balance of USD 350.2 million, having remained almost unchanged as compared with the corresponding period last year (USD 351.6 million).

In the reporting period, the inflow of current transfers to the **general government** (a neutral presentation of the balance of payments) was insignificant and constituted USD 0.1 million. Contributions to international organizations declined by 35.9 percent, constituting USD 0.8 million. As a result, the current transfers by the public sector was formed with a negative balance of USD 0.7 million, while it was formed positive in the amount of USD 32.2 million in the same period last year.

The net inflow of current transfers to **other sectors** (a neutral presentation of the balance of payments) constituted USD 350.9 million, having increased by 9.9 percent compared to the previous year. This increase was traditionally provided by workers' remittances, which occupy 98.6 percent (USD 398.2 million) of the total inflow of transfers to other sectors.

In turn, remittances through transfer systems³ (91.4 percent) occupy the largest share in the gross inflow of workers' remittances. In the reporting period, the net inflow through money transfer systems increased by 18.8 percent (from USD 264.5 to 314.3 million) in comparison to the previous year. At the same, the geographical structure of remittances remains unchanged. At the end of the reporting quarter of this year, the bulk of remittances came from the Russian Federation (95.8 percent), USA (1.9 percent) and Kazakhstan (1.8 percent). Remittances sent to the Russian Federation (97.0 percent) also occupy a major share in the structure of remittances sent from the Kyrgyz Republic.

in percent to GDP




Balance of remittances continues to cover the net exports of consumer goods, which in turn is formed with a negative value of USD 285.1 million.

THE CAPITAL AND FINANCIAL ACCOUNTS

Based on the results of the first quarter of 2012, the balance of the capital and financial accounts (in the analytic representation) was formed with a positive balance of USD 178.9 million, which is 29.0 percent lower than in the first quarter of last year.

The capital account in the reporting quarter was formed with a positive balance of USD 3.7 million against a negative value of USD 11.4 million for the corresponding period in 2011.

The change in this item was affected by operations related to movement of capital of migrants who have

left for permanent residence to foreign countries. In the reporting period, there is a significant reduction in the assets taken out by immigrants: USD 6.3 million versus USD 26.2 million in the first quarter of last year. Assets brought in by migrants constituted USD 4.0 million, which is 34.3 percent more than in the corresponding period in 2011. As a result, the negative net position on the "migrant transfers" item during the reporting period decreased from USD 23.2 to 2.4 million.

The positive balance of the financial account for the reporting quarter decreased from USD 263.3 to 174.7 million mainly due to the reduction of inflow of direct investment.

Thus, the net inflow of funds on direct investments fell by 78.6 percent and constituted USD 45.5 million. In the structure of direct investments, the main decrease accounted for reinvested earnings, volumes of which decreased by 74.9 percent.

In the geographical structure of direct investment, there is a decrease in its inflow mainly from non-CIS countries, particularly from Canada and China. The most attractive economic activities in the opinion of direct investors were the financial sector, real estate and trade.

The "portfolio investment" item for the period under review was formed with a negative balance of USD 37.6 million, whereas the corresponding figure of the first quarter of 2011 was formed with a positive value

in the amount of USD 5.0 million.

The balance of the "other investments" item in the first quarter of this year was positive, constituting USD 167.9 million, which is 3.7 times higher than the indicator in the same period of 2011. This item was formed under the influence of reducing the external assets of residents by USD 53.6 million mainly due to the decrease of funds in the accounts of residents in foreign banks USD by 86.2 million.

External liabilities of the country were formed under the influence of the growth of attracted loans, which totaled USD 155.4 million (in the first quarter of 2011 - USD 85.5 million). The bulk of loans went to the public sector - USD 53.7 million, the private sector has received loans for USD 101.7 million.

Enterprises' amounts payable to non-residents increased by USD 29.6 million, against USD 97.3 million in the first quarter of 2011.

The "**Errors and Omissions**" item was formed with a positive balance in the amount of USD 188.2 million, reflecting the undercount transactions related to capital inflows into the country or undercount of exports of goods and services.

The volume of gross international reserves at the end of the first quarter of 2012 constituted USD 1,862.2 million. The coverage ratio by gold reserves of future imports of goods and services constituted 3.5 months.


Chart I.1. Exchange Rate and the Real Effective Exchange Rate Index
