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## ***Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic***

“Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic” was prepared by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic based on statistical data obtained from government agencies, commercial banks and other sources. The legislative basis for the balance of payments is the constitutional Law of the Kyrgyz Republic as of August 11, 2022 No. 92 “On the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic”. This document reflects the last tendencies in external sector development of the economy and shows statistical data on the balance of payments, external trade, international reserves, external debt and international investment position, as well as construction methods of balance of payments and informational database. This document is published 4 times a year in February, June, August and November and has 3 language versions: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

This publication provides final data of the National Statistical Committee of the Kyrgyz Republic on foreign trade for 2023 in accordance with the annual data revision procedure.

**Last day for update of data for the present publication is October 29, 2024.**

- is set between years or months (e.g., 1994 – 1996 or January – June) and means, that all years and months are covered by the shown dates.

Deviations in last digits may occur because of rounding numbers when summing up.

In regard with the possible changes in accounting methods or historical data, which are used in the given document, correction of earlier published data is acceptable. Therefore, 10 years period can be accounted as “open period”.

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The objective of the Report is to inform the public of the general assessment of financial system stability and sustainability in the Kyrgyz Republic. It is published twice a year in Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

### ***Regulatory Acts of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic***

These are the regulations, instructions and other regulatory acts adopted by the National Bank. Presumable publication frequency is once a month in Kyrgyz and Russian languages.

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
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## CURRENT STATUS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

### Chart 1. Current account

(in percent of GDP)




At the end of the first half of 2024, the current account balance was formed negative in the amount of USD 3,865.5 million (50.3 percent of GDP) under the influence of an increase in the trade deficit and deterioration in the balance of primary income.

In the first half of 2024, the negative **trade balance** of the Kyrgyz Republic in FOB prices totaled USD 4,607.9 million, having grown by 18.2 percent compared to the same period of 2023.

In the reporting period, the **foreign trade turnover** in FOB prices made USD 7,182.7 million, exceeding the comparable figure of the first half of 2023 by 9.7 percent.

**Export of goods in FOB prices** constituted USD 1,287.4 million. Export of goods excluding gold came out at USD 881.7 million, having decreased by 13.8 percent compared to the same period of 2023.

**Import of goods** in FOB prices demonstrated growth by 12.8 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023 and figured up at USD 5,895.3 million.

## STRUCTURE OF FOREIGN TRADE<sup>2</sup>

**Export of goods in FOB prices** decreased by 2.9 percent compared to the same indicator in 2023, to make USD 1,290.3 million. Exports excluding gold fell by 13.8 percent compared to the first half of 2023, down to USD 884.5 million.

At the end of the first half of 2024, the products of industrial sector and agriculture were the basis of the commodity structure of exports.

During the period considered, there was a reduction in the production of non-ferrous metals (by 12.5 percent)<sup>3</sup>. Whereas, in January – June 2024, export of gold exports grew by 34.0 percent compared to the first half of 2023 and totaled USD 405.8 million.

Moreover, during the period under review, there was growth in the output of articles made of iron or steel not included in other categories (by USD 8.5 million). However, there was a reduction in the export of ore and precious metals concentrates (by USD 30.0 million). The fluctuations in the value of these items were conditioned by changes in the physical volume and the average prices of supplies.

According to the NSC KR, at the end of the first half of 2024, growth in gross output of agricultural products resulted from rise in output of livestock and crop production sectors<sup>4</sup>. There was an increase in the supplies of live animals (by USD 5.5 million), milk, cream and dairy products, other than butter and cheese (by USD 3.2 million). In crop production, there was advancement in the supplies of fruits and nuts (by USD 2.0 million), however, among large commodity items there was a reduction in the supplies of vegetables (by USD 4.1 million).

In the first half of 2024, there was an increase in the volumes of production output of textile, clothes and footwear, leather and other leather articles (by 8.6 percent) owing to expansion in clothes output (by 8.8 percent)<sup>5</sup>. Despite this, export of the main products of garment production decreased by 37.1 percent and totaled USD 36.6 million. A decrease was largely conditioned by fall in exports on the items such as “garments made of textile fabrics for women and girls” (by USD 6.3 million), “garments, knitted or crocheted for women and girls” (by USD 4.8 million), and “articles of apparel made of textile fabrics, knitted or non-knitted” (by USD 1.4 million). Changes in other commodity items had slight impact on the export of garment goods.

The share of the non-EAEU countries prevailed in the geographic structure of exports (62.7 percent) compared to the same period of 2023. In the monitored period, the largest volume of goods exports was sent to the United Kingdom, Hong Kong SAR (China), Uzbekistan, Switzerland and Türkiye (in total, the share made 72.9 percent among the non-EAEU countries), goods of processing industry (gold) and agricultural products were generally supplied to these countries.

The aggregate share of the EAEU countries in the total export of goods constituted 37.3 percent respectively. The commodity structure of exports to the EAEU countries is mainly represented by the products of light industry and agriculture. Almost the entire volume of these goods was supplied to Russia (60.6 percent) and Kazakhstan (37.1 percent).

In the first half of 2024, **import of goods** in CIF prices went up by 12.4 percent compared to the same indicator in 2023 and reached USD 6,306.7 million.

In the reporting period, the total value of import of goods of the SITC largest group – “machinery and transport equipment” – advanced by 40.3 percent and came out at USD 3,573.7 million. In the commodity structure of the aforementioned group, the serious increase was observed in supplies on the items “motor cars and motor vehicles principally designed for the transport of people” (by USD 243.9 million), “parts of equipment for production machinery” (by USD 696.5 million) and “parts of harvesting machines and machines for sorting eggs, fruit, seeds, grain” (by USD 106.5 million USD).

Besides, there was a decrease in imports on the item “electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy” (by USD 57.2 million).

According to the results of the first half of 2024, the volume of import of goods of the group “manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” fell by 34.0 percent and figured up at USD 755.8 million. The items such as “knitted or crocheted fabrics” (by USD 281.1 million) and “locksmith’s equipment, safes and hardware” (by USD 133.1 million) demonstrated substantial decline. Furthermore, there was an increase in imports on the items “iron and steel” and “woven fabrics of man-made textile materials” by USD 13.3 million and USD 32.7 million, respectively.

In January – June 2024, import of commodity items of the section “mineral fuel, lubricants and oil” increased by 69.2 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023 and totaled USD 711.3 million. The petroleum products had a considerable share in the commodity structure of imports in this group. During the period considered, the value volume of imported petroleum products grew by 81.3 percent and made USD 560.7 million. There was rise in the supplies of gas oil (by USD 194.5 million), gasoline (by USD 26.4 million) and kerosene (by USD 26.2 million). At the same time, there was a reduction in supplies of lubricants by USD 1.9 million and other petroleum products – by USD 11.5 million.

During the period under review, import of goods of the group “miscellaneous manufactured articles” fell by 21.6 percent and constituted USD 343.3 million. Decrease in value was largely conditioned by the reduction in imports on the item “footwear”, the value of supplies thereof went down by USD 113.6 million, respectively. There was an increase in imports by USD 11.1 million on the item “articles of apparel and clothing accessories”, meanwhile other commodity items of the group demonstrated insignificant change in the value of supplies.

During the period considered, the share of supplies from the EAEU countries fell down to 24.1 percent (at the end of the first half of 2023, 27.4 percent) **in the geographic structure of imports**. Fuel and energy products, the bulk of which is supplied from the Russian Federation and the Republic of Kazakhstan, prevail in the commodity structure of imports from the EAEU countries. A wide range of consumer and investment goods, besides energy carriers, are also imported from these countries.

In the first half of 2024, the share of the non-EAEU countries advanced compared to the same indicator in 2023 (72.6 percent) and came up at 75.9 percent. The upward dynamics of imports from third countries was normally caused by expansion in the supplies of consumer and intermediate goods. China remains the largest trading partner with the share of 65.4 percent of total imports from the non-EAEU countries. In January-June 2024, large volumes of goods were also supplied from Uzbekistan (4.7 percent), Türkiye (4.2 percent), the Republic of Korea (3.8 percent) and Germany (3.3 percent).



## BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

*In the period under review, the balance of international services was formed positive, being conditioned by outstripping growth in export of services compared to import thereof.*

At the end of the reporting period, the **balance of international services** was formed negative equal to the amount of USD 150.2 million, having decreased by 35.5 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023. The export of services grew by 76.9 percent and figured at USD 1,589.1 million, while the import of services rose by 53.7 percent, up to USD 1,739.3 million.

As before, the determining items of export of services were “transport services”, “travels” and “personal, cultural and recreational services”, which in total constituted 78.2 percent of the overall turnover of international services.

Traditionally, negative balance of transport services was changed slightly, having decreased by 8.6 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023 and, as a consequence, reached USD 309.2 million. This trend was conditioned by growth of export of transport services compared to their imports: exports went up by USD 144.9 million or 70.0 percent, basically owing to provided railway and automobile transport services, whereas imports went up by USD 115.6 million or 21.2 percent, respectively, generally because consumption of provided railway and automobile transport services.

The balance of the item “travels” was formed positive in the amount of USD 109.4 million, having fallen by 50.5 percent compared to the first half of 2023 (due to reduction in exports growth and stable upward trend in imports on the item “travels”). In the period under review, the total volume of services related to the trips of the citizens from the foreign countries to the Kyrgyz Republic (travel exports) came down by 15.8 percent and made USD 414.2 million. This decline was predominantly conditioned by reduction in the tourist flow mainly from the neighbouring countries. The volume of services rendered to the residents during their stay abroad (travel imports) went up by 12.6 percent and constituted USD 304.8 million.

The balance of the item “personal, cultural and recreational services” was formed positive and reached USD 89.9 million (against a negative balance of USD 85.9 million in the first half of 2023). Growth on this item was observed in both directions – exports and imports, which is a result of an increase in demand for received and provided services to the individuals, as well as the services in the sphere of culture and recreation. Thus, compared to the same indicator of 2023, the positive balance of the said item was conditioned by the growth of its imports by 2.4 times, up to USD 476.3 million, while its exports grew more markedly – up to USD 386.3 million, i.e. by 6.2 times.

## BALANCE OF PRIMARY INCOME

*Deterioration of the current negative dynamics on the item “primary income” in the period under review was largely conditioned by the influence of a significant growth in the volume of payments on investment income to non-residents.*

Based on the results of six months of 2024, the balance of the item “primary income” was formed negative in the sum of USD 359.3 million, having grown by 25.3 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023. These dynamics were largely conditioned by rise by 27.5 percent, up to USD 411.1 million, in payments by the resident companies on investment income to the foreign investors. The volume of accrued dividends receivable by the residents increased by 41.6 percent and amounted to USD 55.4 million. As a result, the balance of investment income from direct investments was formed negative in the amount of USD 327.7 million, having increased by 21.9 percent compared to the level of income payable in the first half of 2023.

The volume of accrued interest payable on other investments of the public and private sectors totaled USD 83.4 million. Interest receivable on other investments corresponded to USD 55.4 million. As a result, net accrued interest payable on the item “other investments” was formed negative at USD 28.0 million, having grown by 93.4 percent compared to the same indicator in 2023.

During the period covered by the report, the balance of the item “labour remuneration” was formed negative in the amount of USD 3.6 million and came up by 7.1 percent as a result of insignificant increase in the total volume of non-residents’ income from labour activity in the Kyrgyz Republic.

## BALANCE OF SECONDARY INCOME

*Stable growth in net inflow of private sector transfers had a determining influence on the item “secondary income”.*

At the end of the first half of 2024, positive balance of **secondary income** constituted USD 1,251.8 million, having gone up by 11.5 percent through an increase by 11.8 percent in private transfer receipts, up to USD 1,256.2 million.

In the structure of private transfers, as before, almost the entire volume of receipts was provided by the inflow of funds on the item “workers’ remittances”. During the monitored period, the gross inflow of money transfers grew by 6.4 percent, and outflow came down by 15.4 percent. As a result, the net inflow rose by 12.3 percent compared to the first half of 2023 and amounted to USD 1,175.1 million.



Money transfer systems<sup>6</sup> remain the main mode of remittances to the country, which provide more than 62.4 percent of all remittances (there was a decrease in the share from 68.5 percent compared to the end of the first half of 2023). The gross volume of funds received through the money transfer systems were reduced by 2.8 percent compared to the same period in 2023 and constituted USD 934.1 million<sup>7</sup>. The volume of remittances outflow from the country also declined and totaled USD 147.7 million. As a result, the net inflow of individuals' remittances through the money

transfer systems grew by 11.6 percent and made USD 786.4 million. In this context, there was an increase by 30.3 percent in the total volume of remittances through the bank mobile applications (bank cards) and e-wallets (the share in the total inflow of all remittances constitutes about 32.4 percent). The share of postal transfers, as before, remains insignificant.

The geographic structure of remittances remains unchanged. As of the end of the reporting period, the main share of remittances was received from the Russian Federation (93.0 percent). In the structure of remittances forwarded from the Kyrgyz Republic, the weighty share also falls on the Russian Federation (87 percent).

Regarding the results of the first half of 2024, net inflow of labour migrants' remittances assessed as USD 1,252.4 million was insufficient to cover net export of consumer goods, which, in turn, was formed with a negative value in the amount of USD 1,337.7 million.

## CAPITAL ACCOUNT

*The positive balance of the capital account decreased to a large extent as a consequence of a reduction in the inflow of capital transfers.*


In the first half of 2024, the **capital account** was formed with a positive balance in the amount of USD 79.7 million and fell by 19.3 percent, or USD 19.0 million, primarily thanks to a decline by 13.7 percent (USD 11.5 million) in net inflows of public sector's capital transfers from abroad, down to USD 72.2 million.

## FINANCIAL ACCOUNT

*The balance of the financial account was formed negative first of all owing to the dynamics of other and direct investments.*

According to the results of the first half of 2024, net borrowing from the rest of the world, presented in the financial account (analytical presentation of the balance of payments) totaled USD 647.3 million, meanwhile in the same period of 2023, net lending amounted to USD 13.7 million. In the reporting period, as before, the financial account experienced major impact of other and direct investments.

In the first half of 2024, the foreign economic operations on the balance sheet of the item "other investments" provided net lending from the rest of the world in the amount of USD 329.3 million, however, during six months of 2023, net lending to the rest of the world for the same indicator constituted USD 259.8 million. In the reporting period, the dynamics of other investments was primarily conditioned by net incurrence of liabilities. The liabilities of residents outside the Kyrgyz Republic went up to USD 662.3 million (at the end of the same period of 2023, liabilities increased up to USD 15.6 million) as a result of enlargement in the total volume on trade credits and advances to the private sector up to USD 327.0 million. There was an increase up to USD 172.0 million in the volume cash and deposits of the resident banks abroad. At the end of the first half of 2024, the prevailing volume of enterprises' accounts receivable fell on the sectors of transport activity and cargo storage, wholesale and retail trade, processing industry, construction, financial intermediation and insurance.

During the period under review, net acquisition of financial assets was formed positive in the amount of USD 333.0 million resulted mainly from growth of assets of the commercial banks on cash currencies and deposits on foreign accounts up to USD 191.7 million, as well as on trade credits and advances to the private sector of the economy up to USD 131.5 million. In addition, there was an increase in other assets of the private sector of the economy up to USD 9.9 million (in the first half of 2023, other assets were formed negative in the amount equal to USD 0.1 million).

In the first half of 2024, the negative balance on direct investments came up to USD 317.2 million (net borrowing), which was predominantly conditioned by growth in net incurrence of liabilities by the residents assessed as USD 311.6 million due to equity capital of the non-resident direct investors through reinvestment of income totaling USD 293.0 million.

In the sectoral structure, the main volume of direct foreign investment was forwarded to the enterprises of processing industries (net inflow – USD 154.4 million), wholesale and retail trade (USD 65.6 million), information and communication (USD 26.5 million), financial intermediation and

insurance (USD 25.5 million), as well as transport activity and cargo storage (USD 13.4 million). At the same time, there was net outflow from the sectors of professional, scientific and technical activity (USD 5.1 million), arts, entertainment and recreation (USD 0.1 million), as well as education (USD 0.1 million).

The balance of the item “errors and omissions” was formed positive in the volume of USD 3,270.6 million. The volume of gross international reserves at the end of the first half of 2024 constituted USD 3,784.4 million, which covers 3.1 months<sup>8</sup> of future import of goods and services.


