
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CURRENT STATUS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

(in percent of GDP)




At the end of nine months of 2024, the current account balance was formed negative in the amount of USD 4,548.7 million (38.7 percent of GDP), having fallen by 16.2 percent or USD 882.0 million (against negative balance of USD 5,430.7 million during nine months of 2023) under the influence of slight reduction in the trade deficit and improvement in the balance of services and secondary income.

TRADE BALANCE¹

Growth in exports amid slight rise in import volumes became the determinant to condition slight weakening of the trade balance deficit.

According to the results of nine months of 2024, the negative **trade balance** of the Kyrgyz Republic in FOB prices totaled USD 5,942.4 million, having decreased by 4.3 percent compared to the same period of 2023.

In the reporting period, the **foreign trade turnover** in FOB prices made USD 11,439.7 million, exceeding the comparable figure of nine months of 2023 by 9.0 percent.

Export of goods in FOB prices constituted USD 2,748.7 million. Export of goods excluding gold came out at USD 1,894.7 million, having grown by 24.2 percent compared to the same period of 2023.

Import of goods in FOB prices demonstrated growth by 4.0 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023 and figured up at USD 8,691.1 million.

STRUCTURE OF FOREIGN TRADE²

Export of goods in FOB prices decreased by 28.1 percent compared to the same period of 2023, to make USD 2,752.7 million. Exports excluding gold increased by 24.2 percent compared to nine months of 2023, up to USD 1,898.8 million.

At the end of January – September 2024, the products of industrial sector and agriculture were the basis of the commodity structure of exports.

During the period considered, there was a reduction in the production of non-ferrous metals (by 7.5 percent)³. Whereas, in January – September 2024, export of gold grew by 37.8 percent compared to nine months of 2023 and totaled USD 853.9 million.

Moreover, during the period under review, there was growth in the articles of iron or steel not included in other categories (by USD 8.3 million). However, there was a decline in the export of ore and precious metals concentrates (by USD 15.7 million). The fluctuations in the value of these items were conditioned by changes in the physical volume and the average prices of supplies.

According to the NSC KR, at the end of nine months of 2024, growth in gross output of agricultural products resulted from rise in production output of livestock and crop growing sectors⁴. There was an increase in the supplies of milk, cream and dairy products, other than butter and cheese (by USD 8.9 million), meat and meat products (by USD 4.9 million) and live animals (by USD 0.1 million). In crop production, there was advancement in the supplies of vegetables (by USD 5.9 million), however, among large commodity items there was a reduction in the supplies of fruits and nuts (by USD 1.4 million).

According to the results of nine months of 2024, there was an increase in the volume of production output of textile, clothes and footwear, leather and other leather articles (by 13.2 percent) owing to expansion on clothes output⁵. As a result, exports of the main products of garment production increased by 1.4 percent and amounted to USD 88.8 million. Growth was largely conditioned by rise in exports on the item such as “articles of apparel made of textile fabrics, knitted or non-knitted” (by USD 6.8 million). Changes in other commodity items such as “garments made of textile fabrics for women and girls” and “garments, knitted or crocheted for women and girls” had slight impact on the export of garment goods.

The share of the non-EAEU countries prevailed in the geographic structure of exports (54.9 percent) compared to the same period of 2023. In the monitored period, the largest volume of goods exports was sent to the United Kingdom, Uzbekistan; Hong Kong SAR (China); China and the UAE (in total, the share made 79.0 percent among the non-EAEU countries), goods of processing industry (gold) and agricultural products were generally supplied to these countries.

The aggregate share of the EAEU countries in the total export of goods constituted 45.1 percent respectively. The commodity structure of exports to the EAEU countries is mainly represented by the products of light industry and agriculture. Almost the entire volume of these goods was supplied to Russia (72.4 percent) and Kazakhstan (26.1 percent).

At the end of nine months of 2024, **import of goods in CIF prices** went up by 3.7 percent compared to the same indicator in 2023 and reached USD 9,297.6 million.

In the reporting period, the total value of import of goods of the SITC largest group – “machinery and transport equipment” – advanced by 7.7 percent and came out at USD 4,875.8 million. In the commodity structure of the aforementioned group, the serious increase was observed in supplies on the items “parts of equipment for production machinery” (by USD 445.8 million), “parts of harvesting machines and machines for sorting eggs, fruit, seeds, grain” (by USD 162.5 million), “machines for sorting, screening, separating earth, stones, ores” (by 92.4 million USD) and “sewing-machine needles; furniture, parts for the machines and furniture (by USD 71.9 million).

Besides, there was a decrease in imports on the item “motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport of people” (by USD 285.2 million), “electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy” (by USD 75.4 million).

According to the results of nine months of 2024, the volume of import of goods of the group “manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” fell by 18.1 percent and figured up at USD 1,259.4 million. The items such as “knitted or crocheted fabrics” (by USD 311.7 million) and “locksmith’s equipment, safes and hardware” (by USD 136.0 million) demonstrated substantial decline. Furthermore, there was an increase in imports on the items “iron and steel” and “woven fabrics of man-made textile materials” by USD 82.0 million and USD 62.5 million, respectively.

In January – September 2024, import of commodity items of the section “mineral fuel, lubricants and oils” increased by 58.7 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023 and totaled USD 1,065.3 million. The petroleum products had a considerable share in the commodity structure of imports in this group. During the period considered, the value of imported petroleum products grew by 66.8 percent and made USD 861.0 million. There was rise in the supplies of gas oil (by USD 242.4 million), gasoline (by USD 54.3 million) and kerosene (by USD 3.4 million). At the same time, there was a reduction in supplies of lubricants by USD 3.3 million and crude oil – by USD 2.4 million.

During the period under review, import of goods of the group “miscellaneous manufactured articles” fell by 18.3 percent and constituted USD 547.6 million. Decrease in value was largely conditioned by the reduction of imports on the item “footwear”, the value of supplies thereof went down by USD 155.6 million, respectively. There was an increase in imports by USD 10.1 million on the item “drawing instruments”, meanwhile other commodity items of the group demonstrated insignificant change in the value of supplies.

During the period considered, the share of supplies from the EAEU countries increased to 27.7 percent (at the end of nine months of 2023, 26.3 percent) **in the geographic structure of imports**. Fuel and energy products, the bulk of which is supplied from the Russian Federation and the Republic of Kazakhstan prevail in the commodity structure of imports from the EAEU countries. A wide range of consumer and investment goods, besides energy carriers, are also imported from these countries.

During nine months of 2024, the share of the non-EAEU countries fell insignificantly compared to the same indicator in 2023 (73.7 percent) and constituted 72.3 percent. The upward dynamics of imports from third countries was normally caused by expansion in the supplies of consumer and intermediate goods. China remains the largest trading partner with the share of 64.2 percent of total imports from the non-EAEU countries. In January – September 2024, large volumes of goods were also supplied from Uzbekistan (5.3 percent), the Republic of Korea (4.4 percent), Türkiye (4.2 percent), and the USA (3.0 percent).



BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

The negative balance of the international services is conditioned by still significant growth in import of services, despite contribution of exports to reduction in the current deficit during the analyzed period.

At the end of the reporting period, the **balance of international services** was formed negative equal to the amount of USD 96.4 million, having decreased by 78.2 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023. The export of services grew by 81.3 percent and figured up at USD 2,678.7 million, while the import of services rose by 44.6 percent, up to USD 2,775.1 million.

As before, the determining items of the export and import of services were “personal, cultural and recreational services”, “travels” and “transport services”, which in total constituted 77.1 percent of the overall turnover of international services.

During the period considered, the surplus of the balance of the item “personal, cultural and recreational services” amounted to 93.1 million USD (against the negative balance of USD 203.6 million during nine months of 2023). In general, positive dynamics resulted from expansion of both components in the balance: exports and imports, the explanatory factors thereof were an increase in demand for other personal, cultural and recreational services received and provided. Thus, compared to the same indicator of 2023, the positive balance of the item was conditioned by the growth of its exports by 5.3 times, up to USD 817.2 million, while its imports rose up to USD 724.2 million, i.e. by 2 times.

Meanwhile, the positive balance of the item “travels” totaled USD 285.9 million, having fallen by 29.9 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023 (due to reduction in exports growth and sustainable moderate increase in the import of services on the item “travels”). In the period under review, the total volume of services related to the trips of the citizens from the foreign countries to the Kyrgyz Republic (travel exports) decreased by 10.4 percent and made USD 745.9 million. This decline was predominantly conditioned by reduction in the tourist flow mainly from the neighboring countries. The volume of services rendered to the residents during their stay abroad (travel imports) went up by 8.3 percent and amounted to USD 460.1 million.

The negative balance of transport services experienced insignificant changes, having decreased by 16.9 percent compared to the same period of 2023, to make USD 488.2 million. This trend was primarily conditioned by growth of export of transport services compared to their imports: exports went up to USD 483.5 million, or 66.0 percent, basically owing to provision of railway and automobile transport services, whereas imports grew up to USD 971.8 million, or 10.6 percent, respectively, generally because of consumption of provided railway and automobile transport services.

BALANCE OF PRIMARY INCOME

In general, stable growth in the volume of payments on investment income to non-residents conditioned deterioration in the balance deficit of the item “primary income”.

Based on the results of nine months of 2024, the balance of the item “**primary income**” was formed negative in the sum of USD 566.4 million, having grown by 36.4 percent compared to the key indicator of 2023. First of all, this dynamics was conditioned by rise by 36.1 percent, up to USD 646.9 million, in payments by the resident companies on investment income to the foreign investors. Meanwhile, the volume of accrued dividends receivable by the residents increased by 32.9 percent and amounted to USD 86.3 million. As a result, the deficit in the balance of investment income from direct investments reached the amount of USD 560.6 million, having increased by 36.6 percent compared to nine months of 2023.

The volume of accrued interest payable on other investments of the public and private sectors totaled USD 100.0 million. Interest receivable on other investments corresponded to USD 86.3 million. As a result, net accrued interest payable on the item “other investments” was formed negative at USD 13.7 million, having decreased by 54.6 percent compared to the same indicator in 2023.

The balance of the item “labor remuneration” was formed negative in the amount of USD 5.8 million and came up by 15.5 percent as a result of increase in the total volume of payments on non-residents’ income from labor activity in the Kyrgyz Republic.

BALANCE OF SECONDARY INCOME

Stable growth in net inflow of private sector transfers had a determining influence on the item “secondary income”.

At the end of nine months of 2024, positive balance of **secondary income** constituted USD 2,056.5 million, having gone up by 25.8 percent due to growth of receipts of private sector transfers, which includes financial institutions, non-financial enterprises, households and non-profit organizations serving households, by 25.2 percent, up to USD 2,050.5 million.

In the structure of private sector transfers, as before, almost the entire volume of receipts was provided by the inflow of funds on the item “workers’ remittances”. During the monitored period, the gross inflow of remittances grew by 17.4 percent, and the outflow came down by 14.7 percent. As a result, the net inflow rose by 25.6 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023 and amounted to USD 2,046.0 million.



Money transfer systems⁶ remain the main mode of remittances to the country, which provide more than 68.9 percent of all remittances (there was a decrease in the share from 70.5 percent compared to the end of nine months of 2023). The gross volume of funds received through the money transfer systems grew by 14.8 percent compared to the same period in 2023 and totaled USD 1,651.0 million⁷. Conversely, the volume of remittances outflow decreased down to USD 243.4 million. As a result, the net inflow of individuals' remittances through the money transfer systems grew by 30.6 percent

and made USD 1,407.6 million. In this context, there was an increase by 22.2 percent in the total volume of remittances through the bank mobile applications (bank cards) and e-wallets (the share in the total inflow of all remittances constitutes about 25.2 percent). The share of postal remittances, as before, remains insignificant.

The geographic structure of remittances remains unchanged. As of the end of the reporting period, the main share of remittances was received from the Russian Federation (93.3 percent). In the structure of remittances forwarded from the Kyrgyz Republic, the weighty share also falls on the Russian Federation (84.9 percent).

Regarding the results of nine months of 2024, net inflow of labor migrants' remittances assessed as USD 2,046.0 million was sufficient to cover the net export of consumer goods, which, in turn, was formed with a negative value in the amount of USD 1,786.9 million.

CAPITAL ACCOUNT

Increase in the net inflow of public sector capital transfers was the key factor for the surplus of the capital account balance.


During nine months of 2024, the **capital account** was formed with a balance positive in the amount of USD 154.0 million and grew by 3.5 percent, or USD 5.3 million, primarily thanks to an increase by 16.8 percent (USD 21.1 million) in net inflows of public sector's capital transfers, up to USD 146.2 million.

FINANCIAL ACCOUNT

The financial account deficit was primarily determined by predominance of funds borrowing on direct and other investments.

According to the results of nine months of 2024, net borrowing from the rest of the world, presented in the financial account (analytical presentation of the balance of payments), totaled USD 769.8 million, having significantly increased compared to the indicator for the same period in 2023 (net borrowing from the rest of the world amounted to USD 172.9 million). In the reporting period, the financial account experienced major impact of direct and other investments.

In January – September 2024, the negative balance on direct investment came up to USD 514.2 million (net borrowing),

which was predominantly a result of stable growth in net incurrence of liabilities by the residents assessed as USD 529.4 million due to participation in the resident companies' capital by non-resident direct investors through reinvestment of income totaling USD 518.4 million.

During nine months of 2024, foreign economic operations on the balance sheet of the item "other investments" provided net borrowing from the rest of the world in the amount of USD 254.7 million, however, in the same period of 2023, net lending to the rest of the world constituted USD 220.8 million. In the reporting period, the dynamics of receipts on other investments was primarily conditioned by net incurrence of liabilities. The liabilities of residents outside the Kyrgyz Republic went up to USD 1,194.4 million (liabilities increased by USD 1,135.3 million compared to the same period of 2023) as a result of enlargement in the total volume of inflows on loans and borrowings up to USD 575.6 million. Borrowings on trade credits and advances increased up to USD 406.6 million. At the end of nine months of 2024, the prevailing volume of enterprises' accounts receivable fell on the sectors of transport activity and cargo storage, wholesale and retail trade, electricity, gas and steam supply, as well as on the enterprises of processing sector.

During the period under review, net acquisition of financial assets on other investments was formed positive in the amount of USD 939.7 million resulted mainly from growth of assets of the commercial banks on cash currencies and deposits on foreign accounts up to USD 652.8 million, as well as accounts payable on trade credits and advances to the private sector of the economy up to USD 253.6 million. In addition, there was an increase in other assets up to USD 32.8 million (for the base period of 2023, other assets totaled USD 1.0 million).

In the sectoral structure, the main volume of direct foreign investment was forwarded to the enterprises of processing industries (net inflow – USD 266.0 million), wholesale and retail trade (USD 134.0 million), financial intermediation and insurance (USD 54.0 million), professional, scientific and technical activity (USD 35.7 million), information and communication (USD 30.0 million).

CURRENT STATUS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

At the same time, there was net outflow from the sectors of mining operations (USD 12.8 million), construction (USD 7.5 million), as well as arts, entertainment and recreation (USD 3.7 million).

The balance of the item “errors and omissions” was formed positive in the volume of USD 3,969.8 million. The volume of gross international reserves at the end of nine months of 2024 constituted USD 4,301.7 million, which covers 3.5 months⁸ of future import of goods and services.


Chart I.1. Nominal and Real Effective Exchange Rate Indices
